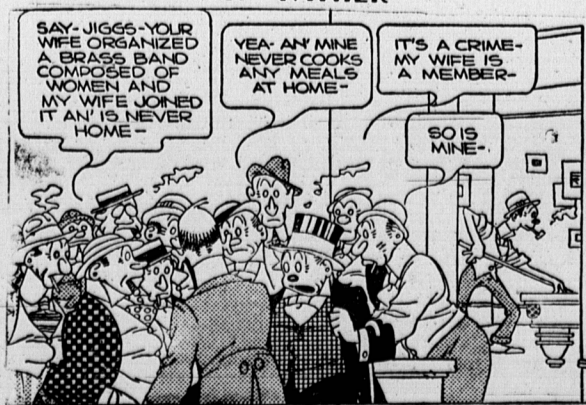

#### UNIQUE MINISTERIAL RECORD

In the year 1786 the Rev. William Moorhead was ordained and inducted into the pastoral charge of Loughaghery Presbyterian Church, County Down, Northern Ireland. After a ministry of fifty years he was succeeded by his son, the Rev. Robert Moorhead, who, for fifty years more, continued minister of that parish. On his death he was in turn succeeded by his son, the Rev. John Nesbit Moorhead, who for considerably over fifty years has been and is still minister in charge, doing the full work of the charge at the age of ninety-three. So that for the space of one hundred and fifty years, without a break, the pastorate of Loughaghery Church has descended from father to son. The Rev. Robert Moorhead Legate, D. D., minister of St. James Presbyterian Church, Charlottetown Prince Edward Island, is the fourth generation on the maternal side of this remarkable succession and has preached in the old pulpit.—The Presbyterian Record.

Possessed of a natural taste for the beautiful and that enviable sixth sense or flair which makes her judgment one to be respected, Her Majesty's interests are wide, and in the pursuit of her hobby she displays as much keenness when making a find as the humblest of the King's subject, and is as pleased to spend an hour in a modest little shop in "The Lanes" at Brighton as in one of the great establishments in the neighborhood of St. James'.

Those fortunate enough to visit Buckingham Palace and Windsor Castle will find evidence enough of the Queen's unflinching taste and judgment in rearranging the Royal art treasures and eliminating those which do not pass her critical discrimination.

Like all collectors, the Queen has her preferences, Chinese Jade being perhaps one of her chief interests. During the past 20 years she has brought together a collection of unusual interest and containing numerous examples, of remarkable quality. She has, in fact, a knowledge of Jade equal to that of many experts, and has only got this collection together by much careful selection.

The many activities of the Oriental craftsman have for her a lasting appeal, and in addition to the Jade she has some fine examples of both champeve and cloisonne enameling, a collection notable both for its comprehensiveness and the high standard of quality, characteristic pieces of lacquer and many fine ivories.

In pictures the Queen perhaps has a preference for flower and garden subjects, though her wide knowledge and accurate judgment of eighteenth-century portraiture has frequently caused surprise.

A few years ago the Queen was the first to detect the wrong ascription to a Gainsborough portrait in the catalogue of the Lady Lever Art Gallery at Port Sunlight Catalogued as a portrait of Princess Sophia, and passed by some of the greatest art authorities, it remained for the Queen to prove that it was a portrait of Anne Luttrell, Duchess of Cumberland.

Though one of the keenest visitors to the antique shops of London and the provinces, the Queen always desires to have the same reception as an ordinary visitor and is strongly averse from such visits in any way affecting the ordinary course of business.

A frequent visitor to the museums she is among the London Museums most generous donors, while her gifts of objects of local interest to provincial museums are well known.

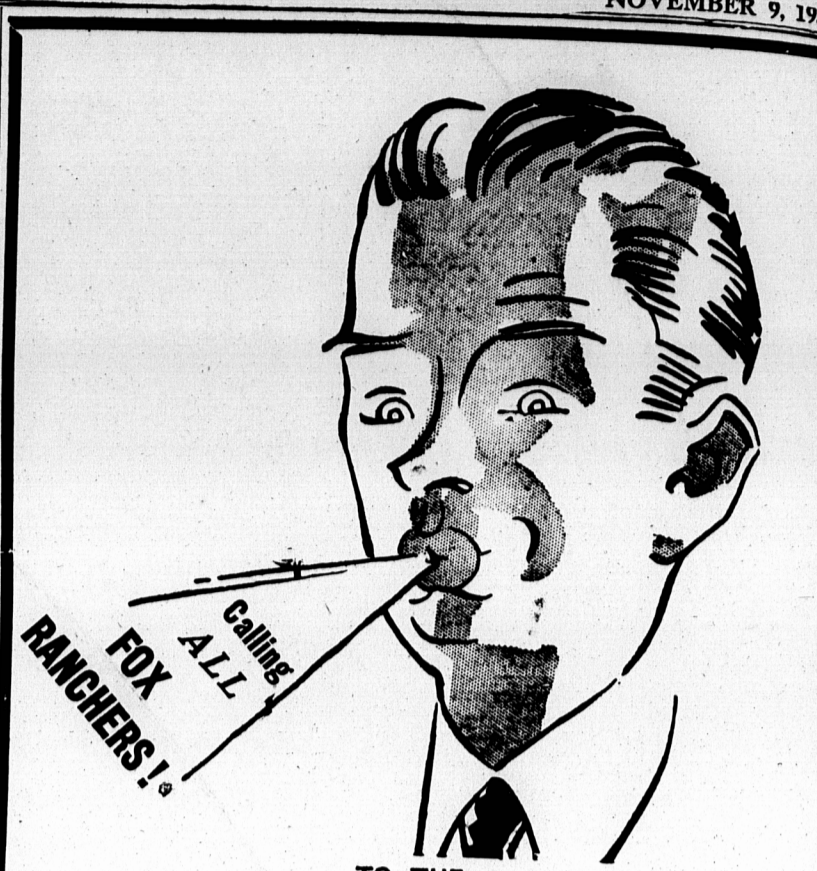
