Synopsis of Canadian North West Land Regulations

THIS sole head of family of any date over eighteen years old, may homestead a quarter section of available Dominion land in Manitoba, Saskatchewan or Alberta. Applicant must appear in person at the Dominion Lands Agency or Sub-Agency for the District. Entry by proxy may be made and Dominion Lands Agency but not Sub-Agency on certain conditions. Duties—Six months residence upon and cultivation of the land in each of three years. Homesteader may live within nine miles of his homestead on a farm of at least 80 acres, on certain conditions. A habitable house must be obtained as soon as homestead patent, on certain conditions. A settler who has exhausted his homestead right may take a purchased homestead in certain districts. Price \$100 per acre. Duties—Must reside six months in each of three years cultivate 50 acres and erect a house worth \$500. The area of cultivation is subject to reduction in case of rough, scrubby or stony land. Live stock may be substituted for cultivation under certain conditions. W. W. \$25,000 TO DALHOUSIE COLLEGE MEMORY OF SON

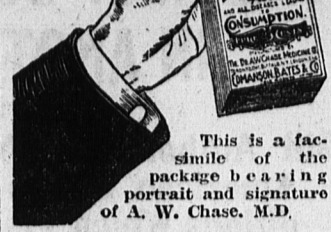
(Canadian Press Despatch.) HALIFAX, February 27.—Mr. and Mrs. G. S. Campbell have given \$25,000 to Dalhousie university to found a series of valuable scholarships, the noble gift to be in memory of their son George H. Campbell, who enlisted in the senior year and fell in action at the front.

The governors of the university have gladly accepted the magnificent offer, adopting the following resolution at a meeting held yesterday: "That the board of governors of Dalhousie college have heard with a sense of the greatest admiration of the noble and generous gift by the chairman of the board and Mrs. Campbell of the sum of \$25,000 to commemorate their only son George H. Campbell, B. A., '15, who enlisted for overseas service during his senior year at the university and was killed while on duty at the front. The board accepts with much pleasure this gift and will direct it to the purposes which the donors have stated in Mr. Campbell's letter of 21st February, 1917, namely, in the giving of scholarships to help young men of ambition but of limited means to secure the advantages of a liberal education."

HOME PARCELS BRING GOOD CHEER

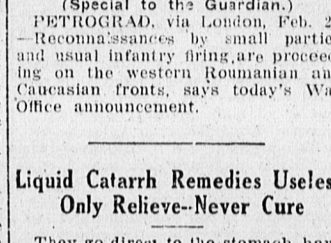
The following letter has been received by Mr. John McBride, Scotch Fort from his son L. Corpl. James McBride, Somewhere in France, dated Jan 11, 1917. Dear Father:—Just a few lines in answer to your welcome letter received a few nights ago; also the cake that mother sent me. It was fine, I thank her very much and it did not last long as I had to divide it among all the boys of the section. I got two parcels from Regina, Xmas week, they are very welcome here in the trenches. I did not get that other parcel from the island that you spoke of, I hope it comes soon. Well dear father I am in the front line now and the mud is our greatest enemy as it manages to rain during the twenty-four hours, making it very miserable in the trenches. I am very glad to hear that you are getting a picture of Princess Patricia. I have no doubt it will be a soon one—take care of it as we all think a lot of our Honorary Colonel. Well father I am writing this letter in my dug-out some distance below the level of the ground. It is raining outside and it makes the trenches very muddy. The nights are very dark here so if you go wandering a long through the trenches you are liable to run up against some one, or if you step off the trench mat, you go to your knees in mud. Let us hope that the approaching season and good will among men will do something to stop the suffering and the murder of human lives. I will close wishing you all the compliments of the season. WELFARE OF RETURNED SOLDIERS.

OTTAWA, February 27.—The parliamentary committee dealing with the welfare of returned soldiers will not be confined to sessions here, but has announced the following meetings: Montreal, March 15 and 16; Toronto, March 21, 22, 23 and 24. A sub-committee may be delegated to go to the west. It is hoped to have a report ready when parliament meets on April 19th. Colonel Patzer, acting director of medical services, was today closely questioned as to the system upon which the granting of pensions was based. Senator McLennan, of the hospital commission, stated that vocational training of returned men had proved a great success. All work had been sold, and more requested. The report of Lieutenant Colonel Marlowe on medical service was tabled, but will not be made public until next week.
