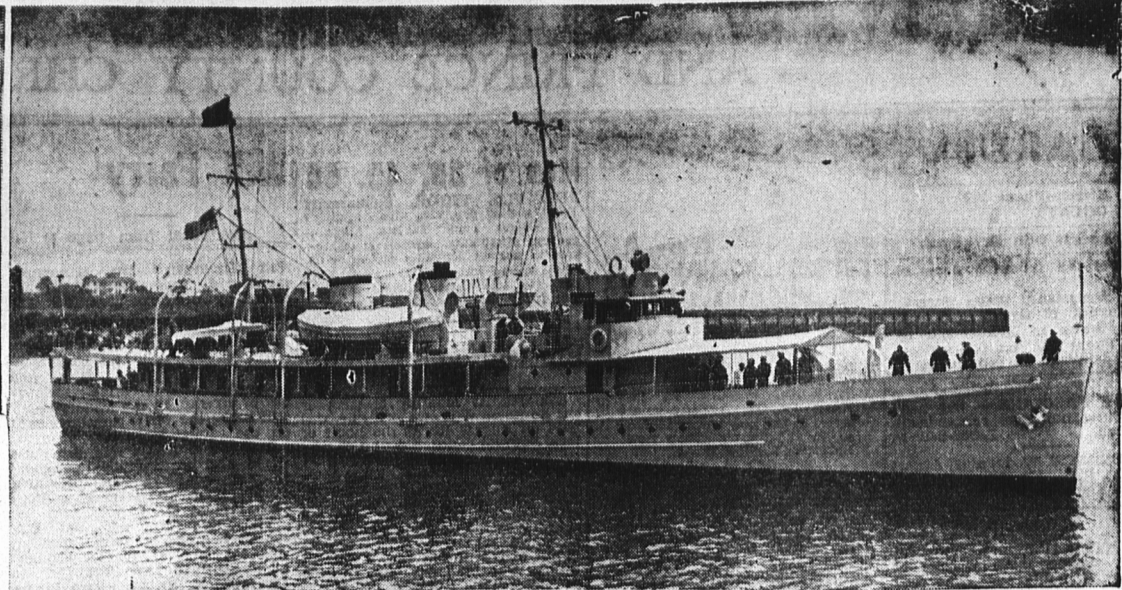

## President and Prime Minister Hold Historic Meeting "Somewhere at Sea"



HE'S "FRANKLIN"

Since January, it was learned, President Roosevelt and Prime Minister Churchill have been "Franklin" and "Winston" to each other, although they had never met, only conversed by transoceanic telephone. Now their first meeting has resulted in a history-making eight-point statement of joint war and post-war victory aims.



Prime Minister Churchill meets Harry Hopkins, U.S. lease-lend plan chief, reported to be either on his way back from London or now in the United States. He was believed present at the conference which resulted in the joint statement of victory aims. Hopkins one of the most zealous New Dealers from its start, is often termed the president's right-hand man. Prime Minister Churchill arrived safely in England yesterday.



HE'S "WINSTON"

Determination to achieve "the final destruction of the Nazi tyranny" was voiced in a joint declaration by Prime Minister Churchill and President Roosevelt. They also sent a joint letter to Josef Stalin, expressing their admiration for the Russian fight against German aggression and their intention of continuing full aid.

It is supposed that the historic meeting between the heads of the great democracies took place on President Roosevelt's yacht, the Potomac, pictured here. The releases merely said they were "surrounded by the waters of the Atlantic."
