#### POINTS TO BE CONSIDERED.

We have had nearly five years of prohibition under the provincial Prohibitory Law in Charlottetown and it is worth while in view of the proposed extension of the law to the entire Province to take note of the working of the law in this city. Let it be borne in mind that Charlottetown as the most populous centre, the principal seaport, the seat of government and of the courts, the place where the exhibitions, military camps and larger gatherings within the Province are held, and having been from time immemorial the head-quarters of the liquor traffic in the Island is the hardest spot within the provincial boundaries to give effect to such a law.

Moreover we have had during the prohibition period the construction of the Hillsboro Bridge giving employment to a large body of imported workers in our midst, while near at hand have been the extensive works involved in the building of the Murray Harbor Railway. We have also had within the same period a federal and a provincial general election and one or more civic elections all of which bring with them conditions of especial temptation to drink and to sell liquor

unlawfully for the supply of the demand created by such conditions.

How has the law stood the test of these trying emergencies? We state without hesitation or fear of contradiction that the years under prohibition, and notably the later years, have been the most sober, quiet and orderly within the memory of living persons; that the number of arrests for drunkenness, has steadily diminished; that the former prevalence of disorder and furious driving on the roads leading to and from the city have almost ceased; pauperism has steadily diminished and there is not now one fourth part as much begging on the streets as there was in the days before prohibition.

It was said the law could not be enforced. It has been enforced till liquor selling in Charlottetown has been made unprofitable and reduced to a minimum. True there is some liquor still sold, just as there are some goods smuggled or stolen from day to day. It was said that if the law were enforced it would greatly injure trade. This fear has not been realized. Our dry goods merchants, grocers, butchers, hardware men, clothiers and furniture men generally report an excellent year, and a number of them report the largest trade in their history.

The reason for this is obvious. The money which before in so many instances was squandered in the dramshops or paid in fines at the police court is now expended in the stores for family supplies or in the market for meats and vegetables. Our farmers realize this when they come to the city on market days and sell their produce readily at excellent prices. In fact the law has worked so well that not a few who before were doubtful or opposed to it are now the earnest advocates of prohibition.

Not the least of the good effects of the law has been the removal of the temptation from the young who have been prevented from forming an enervating appetite that would have mortgaged their future. Others who had begun to drink have, by the closing of the saloons been saved from developing the pernicious appetite. In these and in many other ways the law has done great good. Of course these results have not been attained without effort, watchfulness and zeal on the part of the Prosecutor and those who support him in his work. Mr. Jenkins has proved a rarely judicious and effective officer in the difficult task which he has undertaken. And above all, devout persons see and believe that the blessing of Heaven has rested on the Prohibitory Law. It has proved a good Law for Charlottetown; it will be equally a good law for the entire Province when extended thereto.

### YUKON OUTPUT IS RETROGRADING

OTTAWA, January 27.—Jos. Tyrrell, a well known Yukon employer and mining engineer, who was in the city yesterday, spoke in very discouraging terms of the situation in the Yukon. He said the output of gold this year will be \$7,000,000, as against \$10,000,000 last year, and that the output is in the transition stage. Mr. Tyrrell stated that the charges made by the White Horse Pass Railway had made the cost of living excessive. He said that the railway was paying five per cent on a capitalization of \$10,000,000 but not one-fifth of that amount was actually invested in the road. The population of the Yukon is now between 5,000 and 6,000, 2,000 of which is in Dawson City. A meal in Dawson City costs \$1, a glass of whiskey 25 cents, and a newspaper the same price.
