Membership Increased Upwards of 200—Carnegie Division, Bradalbane the Banner Division. Resolutions Passed.

Owing to the impassable roads and the blinding storm the attendance was not nearly so large as it otherwise would have been, but it was ample for a good meeting, and the meeting was good. The reports of the G W P, G Scribe and G Treas, were read and delegated to the proper committees. That of the G W P dealt with matters of general interest to the Order and will appear at length; that of the G Scribe urged greater unity in our divisions, and while the dignity of the Grand Division must at all times be upheld, it besought the members of the Order not to enter into private quarrels but to save all their united strength to fight the common enemy—the liquor trade; that of the G Treasurer showed the finances to be in a good condition. The membership increased upwards of 200 during the past quarter with many of the best divisions still to hear from. Carnegie Division at Bradalbane is now the banner division having 104 members. Refuge is second with 98 and Triumph third with 93. The Divisions reporting a gain in membership during the quarter are here placed in order of gain made. The present membership is placed after each.

Divisions reporting neither gain nor loss: Hazelbrook 45, Fair Play 34, Shamrock 25.

Divisions reporting slight losses, Holdfast 54, Heather 39, Port Hill 10, King Edward 34.

Division reporting largest net gain was Triumph having gained 20 members. Division reporting largest loss was King Edward, having lost 4.

Divisions working but not reporting on time were Try Again, Eclipse, Ever Onward, Elliot, Burns, Hearty, Helping Hand, Mayflower, Kingston Star.

New Divisions organized during quarter, Steadfast 52 members and Alexandra 32 members.

It is very gratifying to note that while many of our Divisions have made large net gains, very few report a net loss and that only slight, and almost all show increased interest.

The following representatives were implicated into the G. D., viz., Sisters Mamie McLeod and Bertha Hayes, Bros. Wm. Burleigh, Lester Cain and G.P. McArthur. The reports of the Sessional committees were received and duly dealt with. Many interesting verbal reports of Divisions were given by the brethren present.

The following resolutions were passed on motion of the Grand Scribe seconded by Bro. W. K. McKay.

Resolved: That this Grand Division in regular session assembled do highly commend the action of Councillors Hooper, Prowse, Rogers and Paton, who in the best interests of temperance, society and good government successfully opposed the recent petition of the liquor interests of Charlottetown to have the City Council request the Legislature to repeal the Prohibitory Law in the said city.

Resolved that this Grand Division do declare itself in favor of the repeal of the C. T. A. in the counties of this Island in order to bring the Prohibition Act into full effect all over the Province.

Resolved that this Grand Division do thank the good people of Ellerslie for their very kind entertainment of us today.

Resolved that a sufficient sum be voted to pay the per capita tax to the National Division.

Resolved we adjourn.

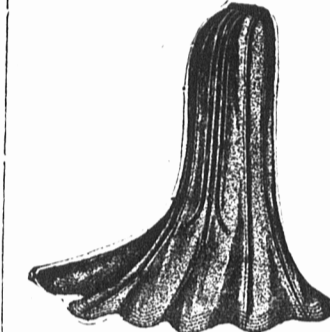
