BOUNTY CURBS DAMAGE TO FISHERIES BY SEALS

Continuing the bounty plan as a means of curbing the damage done to the fisheries by seal seals, the Dominion Department of Fisheries paid bounty on 6,308 killed in British Columbia waters during the past fiscal year. The bounty is \$2.50 for each seal destroyed and the nose of the seal must be produced as proof of destruction. The number of bounty claims during the year was 364 larger than in the preceding fiscal. The increase was mainly in the Alert Bay district where 1,054 seals were taken.
