The body of James K. McMillan, son of Hector McMillan, Fortune Bridge, who was killed accidentally in Revelstoke, B. C., and to which brief reference has already been given in The Guardian, arrived in Summerside on the 1st inst., accompanied by his two brothers. The I. O. G. T., Fortune Bridge met them in Souris. Of both orders, the deceased was a member. The members of D. Lue y Lodge Dundas (Orange) took charge of the funeral and the body was interred with the ceremonies of Orange society. Deceased was also a member of the Woodmen of Canada and the World, Rev. Mr. McLeod officiated at the funeral. A large concourse of people followed the remains to the Fortunate Cemetery, where they were laid to rest. He was an exemplary young man; his body lies there till the resurrection of the last trumpet. He had been employed as brakeman on the C. P. R. On the day of the accident he arrived in Revelstoke at 11, put away the engine and was coming back to his cubby to change his clothes. When he was standing still between some cars the yard engine came along and moved them and knocked him over. The cars passed over him and nearly severed both legs from his body. He lived about five hours afterwards.—Com.

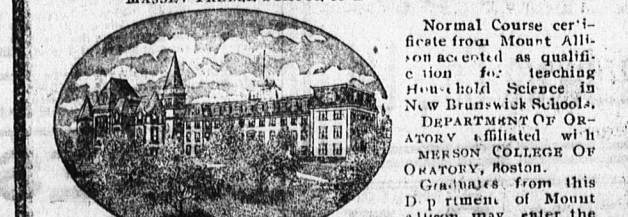
