## WARSAW STILL HOLDING THROUGH BITTER FIGHTING

Battle now Raging under Walls of City, Poles and Reds Alternately Advancing and Retiring. Hope Abandoned of Saving the City.

PARIS, August 16.—Warsaw was still holding last night, as far as known, but the battle raging under the walls of the city is increasing in violence. From vague, scant news reaching Paris the Poles are making a good fight, but seemingly all they can hope for is a delay until the fatal hour of the city falls. The Reds continue advancing and have reached a point less than ten miles from the Capital.

WARSAW, August 16.—In the region east of Cholm, forty miles east of Lublin the Poles broke through the enemy line, and pursued Bolsheviki to the right bank of the Bug River according to an official statement of the fighting issued tonight. The Poles occupied Dorohusk, Swiez, Rubieszow. The Polish cavalry strengthened by infantry detachments fighting in the region of Radzichow and Chertow west of the Stry River. General Budenyi's Bolsheviki cavalry which outnumbered Poles.

## EXPECT SOME CONCESSIONS IN IRISH DISORDERS ACT

Both Parties Realizing Hopelessness of Guerilla Warfare are Ready to Make a Compromise.

## TWO OCEAN LINERS WERE IN COLLISION

C. P. R. Tunisian and Furness Liner Collide at Red Island, St. Lawrence, Both Badly Damaged.

QUEBEC, August 15.—The Canadian Pacific Ocean liner Tunisian, from London and Havre and the Furness freighter Manchester Division from Manchester, limped into port here this morning. The Tunisian at 3 a.m. and the Manchester Division at 10.40, both considerably damaged as a result of colliding off Red Island shortly after three o'clock Saturday afternoon. Both vessels were inward bound and from what could be learned of the circumstances of the accident it appears that the Manchester Division, coming into a thick fog though it prudent to anchor, as she was riding at anchor with the tide ebbing, she was toiling her bell as a warning to other craft, when suddenly the Tunisian loomed up through the fog. When both vessels sighted each other it was apparently too late to avoid the collision and they came together bow-on. When the impact occurred the passengers on the Tunisian became panic stricken, especially the foreigners in the third-class quarters, but they were gradually calmed down by the ship's officers, who on making an examination of the vessel's damages found that she had not suffered below the water line and was in no danger of sinking. The Tunisian had her starboard side ripped open for about fifty feet while the Manchester Division suffered serious damage on her port side but also above the water line. Both vessels were able to continue after the accident. The Tunisian which reached this port early this morning cleared for Montreal at 11 o'clock.
