A NEW YORK HOLOCAUST

Twenty-three Human Beings Burned to Death

Or Lost Lives in Frenzied Struggles to Reach Fire Escapes. Heart Rending Screams of Women.

NEW YORK, Nov. 1.—Twenty-one men and three women and a ten months' old babe were burned to death or suffocated in a fire that started early this morning in the five story tenement house at No. 422 Eleventh Avenue and which the police and coroner believe to have been of incendiary origin.

Some of the peculiar features of the disaster, in addition to the startling loss of life, are that the fire was practically extinguished in twenty minutes, that the police could learn of but one person being injured, other than those who lost their lives, and that the property loss was only \$7,000. The dead were mostly Italians.

The only person injured, so far as can be learned, is Mary Jane Quinn, aged 47 years of age, who was burned about the face and hands and severely bruised by leaping from the second floor fire escape to the ground.

In several apartments in the tenement Halloween parties were in progress and the guests in these added greatly to the number of persons in the house and made the crush greater to escape than it would ordinarily have been. The house was plentifully provided with fire escapes, front and rear, but escape here was cut off a few minutes after the fire started by the bodies of the dead becoming wedged in the openings leading to the ladders. The fire had been burning for some minutes before it was discovered. It had started in the basement and rushing upward, had attacked the stairway leading to the apartments. In a short space of time the flames had so enveloped the stairways that egress from the building by it was impossible. The house from the third to the fifth floor was entirely destroyed.

At the windows, front and rear, bodies of men and women were jammed showing that a desperate struggle to get free had resulted in the complete choking of these exits to the fire escapes and had been the cause of a number of the inmates being suffocated. Perhaps the most tragic sight was that which the firemen saw on a bed alongside a window at the rear of the fourth floor, where were the bodies of five men. Each had clutched the one next to him in an endeavor to push him away in order to get to the fire escape outside. The features of the men were distorted, some with rage, others with agony, and in two instances the men had gripped each other so hard that blood had been drawn and ran over their hands.

On the third floor were found the bodies of Maculets Vingiguero, and her baby. The mother had crawled to the front window and succeeded in grasping the sill when she was suffocated. In her arms lay the body of her child. On the third floor in an apartment where a Halloween party was being held, John O'Toole, one of the occupants, started to go to the street. He was met by a volume of smoke as he opened the door. He ran to the fire escape, followed by all those in the flat with the exception of his mother, whose charred body was found later lying at the entrance to the apartment. O'Toole and the others escaped.

When the firemen reached the scene there was a mass of flames bursting through the middle of the roof, while the air was filled with heart-rending screams of the women and the curses of men. Many daring rescues were made by the firemen, who at times had to use violence in their attempts to disentangle the mass of writhing human beings struggling to reach safety from the crowded fire escapes. One fireman climbed up a ladder to the second floor and then mounted to the window sill on the fourth floor to where a window was filled with a mass of people, jammed in and fighting to get out. He struck the heads of all the men he could see with his fist, and they fell back. He then handed down to the firemen on ladders below three women and a baby. Another fireman performed a similar feat and rescued two girls from the fourth floor.

Life nets played a prominent part in the work of rescue. The firemen dropped men and women, dead and alive, from one floor to another and finally the men standing on scaling ladders on the first floor let them fall into the nets held by policemen and firemen in the street. The building was known as 'The House of All Nations,' because of the different nationalities of its tenants.

CADETS ARRESTED CHARGED WITH HAZING.

ANNAPOLIS, Md., Oct. 31.—First class Cadets E. W. Chaffee, of Wisconsin; J. H. Lefland, of Iowa, and J. D. Little, of Ohio, were placed on the prison ship Santee at the naval academy wharf, charged with hazing fourth class men. It is learned that the hazing consisted of personal indignities.

BIG MACKEREL CATCH.

HALIFAX, Nov. 1.—Immense schools of mackerel have struck in on this coast, and the fishermen from St. Margaret's Bay as far east as Halifax harbour, made great hauls Saturday and today, more than 8,000 being secured in this vicinity.
