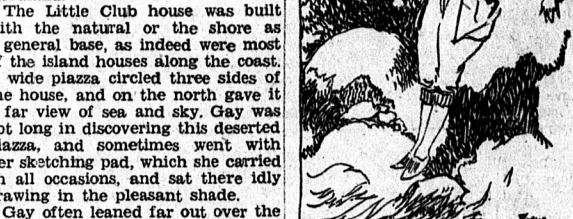
RESOLUTION RE KELLOGG-BRIAND TREATY
(Canadian Press)
WASHINGTON, Dec. 14—A resolution declaring United States rights in respect to the Kellogg-Briand anti-war treaty and proposed to be adopted with ratification of that pact was offered late today by Senator Moses, Republican of New Hampshire. The resolution goes to the foreign relations committee which meets again on Monday to vote on the peace pact. Senator Moses who believes he has majority support in committee for his resolution will ask its adoption at the same time the vote is taken by the Senate on ratification of the treaty.
