BLIGHT ON TEA PLANTATIONS.—In India, and to quite an extent in Ceylon, the two largest tea producing countries in the world, the tea crop for the current year has been disappointingly small largely owing to the labor troubles fomented by the "non-co-operation" doctrines of Chandi, but also to a considerable extent due to climatic adversities. Drought at times, excessive rains at others, coupled with bad blights in some districts have very seriously effected the output of good teas this year.

ENJOYABLE BANQUET HELD BY CROWN LIFE REPRESENTATIVES. The Crown Life banquet in the plan room of the Brunswick Hotel on Thursday evening was very jolly and enjoyable affair.
