THE OLD GARDENER SAYS

There will be plenty of time to see out dahlias bulbs for the next week or ten days. Dahlias really give better results in the fall when they do when forced for summer blooming. There are plenty of other flowers for summer, too. Be certain that you plant the dahlias deep enough. Six or eight inches is about right. Always lay the cut tubers on their sides, instead of standing them upright. It is taken for granted that you will cut up the clumps instead of planting them whole.

G. W. V. A. Adopts Strong Resolution

The following resolution was adopted by the Souris Branch of the G. W. V. A. and forwarded to the Guardian for publication:

WHEREAS applications were invited by public notice for the position of Inspector of the Harbour improvements at North Lake, P. E. I., and

WHEREAS the following returned soldiers made application for the position, viz.—Gr. Adrian Melnick of Red Point, recommended by the Souris Branch G. W. V. A., and John D. Campbell of Elmira, recommended by the Charlottetown Branch G. W. V. A., and

WHEREAS both these men are considered competent for this position, trustworthy and of good standing in their community and

WHEREAS notwithstanding the Government regulations to the contrary, the Inspectorship of this work has been given to Columbia McDonald of Lakeville, who while competent for the position, is not a returned soldier, therefore

RESOLVED that this Branch of the G. W. V. A. strongly protest against the unfairness of such treatment by the Dominion Government through its officials to these returned men, and that copies of this resolution be sent to the Minister of Public Works, Ottawa, Mr. James McIsaac representing Kings County, House of Commons, Hon. Senator McLean and to the press of P. E. Island.

FURTHER RESOLVED that the Minister of Public Works, Ottawa, be requested to give this Branch any reason why a returned man recommended by it as competent and trustworthy should not receive the appointment, and if any adverse report of these returned men has been given by the Local Engineer of the Department and to ensure it the representative of the County and the Provincial command of the G. W. V. A. have been consulted.

FURTHER RESOLVED that this Branch while admitting Mr. McDonald's fitness for the work publicly declare the appointment absolutely unfair to returned men and against the professed intention of the Dominion Government.

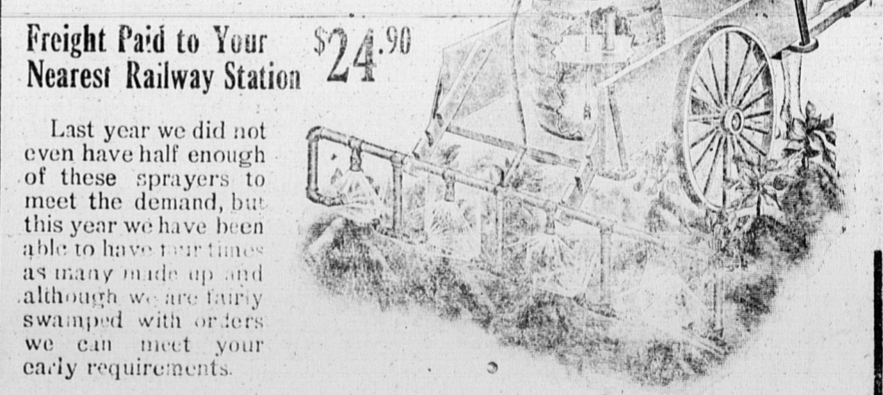
It's a fortunate thing for most people that they can get used to anything in the course of time.
