

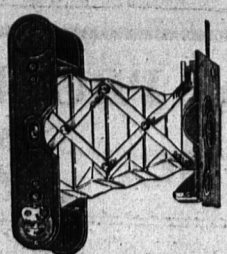

WAR RELICS ON EXHIBITION.—The Moncton Times says: "The west window of J. D. Croaghan Company's Store on Main St., contains a very interesting collection of war relics sent home by Major Stanley of Charlottetown, P. E. I., an officer who has seen long and very active service at the front. The collection includes among other things, a card containing several varieties of Belgian and French uniform buttons and cap badges, a French trench (shrapnel proof) helmet, a German cloth cap, two German bayonets, and one bayonet scabbard, several rifle cartridges, both loaded and empty; the fuse head of a German shell; and a number of French banknotes of a special war issue, due in 1920. The collection is one of the most interesting which has been placed on exhibition in Moncton for some time past and has attracted a great deal of attention.
