Shipping News

THE HAVERFORD IS ENROUTE TO HALIFAX.

The American liner Haverford is enroute to Halifax with nearly 800 passengers. The steamer sailed from Liverpool on last Friday afternoon and is due to arrive at Halifax on Saturday or Sunday enroute to Philadelphia. She has 39 cabin and 713 third class passengers to land at Halifax, also 647 packages of letters and 187 packages of parcel post. On board are a British Ministry of Shipping party of 12 cabin and 21 third-class passengers. The Haverford will make another trip next month.

THE CARMANIA OFF FOR NEW YORK

After taking on 500 tons of coal at Halifax, the Cunard liner Carmania, Captain Melsom, sailed at eleven o'clock Tuesday morning for New York, for which port she has on board nearly 1,000 passengers. The Carmania arrived on Monday morning and after landing her Canadian passengers at Pier Two, shifted to the South End Terminal to coal. The Nova Scotia Steel and Coal Company, who supplied her with bunkers, did the job in five hours. They commenced work at four o'clock and had the coal on board by ten that night. The port bunkers were supplied by the coaling towers, while those on the starboard side were attended to by the large Twin Sisters.

PIRATES HELD UP FRENCH STEAMER AND ROBBED PASSENGERS

Pirates held up the French pack steamer, which left Beatum, May 6, for Marseilles, and after robbing the passengers, went ashore in a boat, which they compelled members of the crew to man. Among those robbed were several women, whose husbands are connected with relief work in Armenia. They were fleeing before the Bolshevik advance and were compelled to give up their money and jewelry at the point of the revolver.

The pirates boarded the steamer at Beatum, either as passengers or members of the crew. At nine o'clock on the night of May 6, fifteen men sprang up from various parts of the ship, covered officers and passengers with pistols and took possession. The women passengers were later taken off by a French destroyer. They arrived at Constantinople May 10.

SHIP DESERTED BY CREW.

Service between Vancouver and Prince Rupert, Anyox and Stuart was cut off Saturday when the steamer Prince Rupert on arrival from the north was deserted by her crew. A ten day service to the northern port and Skagway will be maintained by the Canadian Pacific Prince Mary, which cleared Saturday night. The Canadian Pacific steamers are carrying on as usual, excepting small coal burners. There has been no formal move toward settlement of the dispute.
