CITY AND COUNTRY REPRESENTATION.

The question of larger representation for the cities of Canada has come up for discussion since the publication of the census figures, and the near prospect of a redistribution bill.

are scattered over 200 to 300 square miles of thinly populated rural districts. In cities all the citizens have the opportunity to see their resident representative from day to day.

Very probably the larger cities will get more representation under the new redistribution bill because of their rapid growth, and also because of the decrease of population in the rural districts, but it does not at all follow that they should be given the same representation in proportion to their population as the country districts.

Furthermore it is neither practicable nor desirable that all constituencies shall have precisely the same population. The clause in the British North America Act providing for representation in proportion to population was devised solely for apportioning the representation between Provinces, and was not intended as a strict rule for dividing a Province into electoral divisions.

SIR WILFRID CHANGES HIS SEAT.

Sir Wilfrid Laurier, although his government was defeated at the polls in September was himself elected for two seats, Quebec East and Soulanges. In a recent interview he announced his intention to sit for Soulanges, thus abandoning the representation of a seat in Quebec East which he has held since 1877.

A seat was then found for him in Quebec East where he has been many times re-elected, usually with enormous majorities. In the general election of 1908 Sir Wilfrid was elected for Ottawa and Quebec East but chose to sit for the latter seat. The attachment between the Liberal leader and the constituents whom he has represented for a third part of a century has been very strong on both sides, and we feel assured that the severance would not be made at present except for somewhat important reasons which are sufficiently apparent.

The reasons given by the Star for Sir Wilfrid's decision are that the Ex-Premier must decide for which of the two constituencies he will sit; that one of the two seats must shortly be opened for the election of a new member; that Quebec East is quite a safe Liberal seat, whereas if Soulanges were opened the seat would probably be carried by the ministerial party. Sir Wilfrid therefore regretfully parts company with his former supporters in Quebec city in order that the Opposition under his leadership may have a good chance of holding both the seats which his personal popularity carried in September.

AN ALLEGED CORRUPTION FUND.

Editor J. A. Macdonald of the Toronto Globe, who has been visiting in St. Paul, gave an interview to the Pioneer Press of that city in which he is reported to have stated that he believes "that \$1,500,000 was spent in Canada in defeating the Reciprocity Treaty. Of this sum he believes the lumbermen contributed \$500,000 the paper men \$500,000 while the remaining \$500,000 was obtained from varied interests."

It often happens that persons who have taken an active part in an election which resulted differently from what they had hoped and expected, attribute the defeat to a large corruption fund in the hands of the opposing party. It seems at this distance quite improbable that this vast sum, or any sum at all of American money was used in the election of September in Canada. We do not find any evidence in this Province, or in the Eastern Provinces generally, of any larger expenditure in the September contest than is usual in our general elections. But if foreign money was used in sums large or small to corrupt the Canadian electorate in the last election, the fact cannot be too strongly resented. And if Mr. Macdonald can produce any satisfactory evidence that a large corruption fund from across the border was used in the election it is his duty to do so. We hardly think the evidence will be forthcoming.

MORE GOLD IN ALASKA RICHEST QUARTZ EVER.

TACOMA, Oct. 31—September and October earthquakes in South Western Alaska shook up the earth and glaciers along the coast to such an extent as to expose what miners say are the world's richest gold quartz vein.

Excitement similar to that of the Klondyke strike in 1897 prevails at Valdez, and other Southern Alaska towns. Quartz samples from Port Wells, ninety miles west of Valdez, assay over 2400 per ton, one eighth of the total weight of the rock being pure gold.

MORE DEVELOPMENTS IN THE RICHESON CASE

BOSTON, Oct. 23—The third day's session of the Suffolk County Grand Jury, which has heard the testimony of about 30 witnesses in connection with the attempt to secure an indictment against the Rev. Mr. Richeson, was brought to an unexpected early adjournment yesterday by the desire of the District Attorney, to look up important new evidence. The adjournment was taken until yesterday afternoon.
