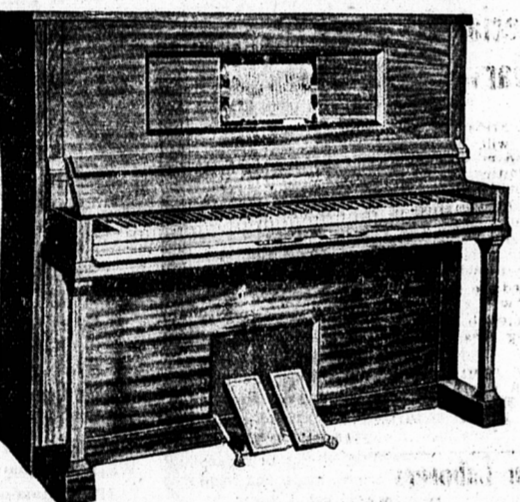
By-Election in Colchester Sept. 20

German Troops To East Prussia

(Dom. Press Special.) PARIS, August 2.—Germany has issued orders for troops to be sent to the east Prussian frontier if necessary to guard against Poles and Bolsheviks who may carry their warfare across it. A note to the Allies said that the Entente not having replied to previous requests for permission to send German soldiers to the frontier the German Government had authorized the commission at Allenstein, East Prussia, to send troops to the border if necessary. The original request, sent July 21, said Polish-Russian disturbances made the presence of German troops on the border imperative.
