Speech Made By Alexander Martin, M. P. For Queen's in The Dominion House of Commons In Moving For Papers And Correspondence.

(Continued.) (From Hansard.) AFTER RECESS. House resumed at eight o'clock. Mr. A. MARTIN (Queens). Mr. Speaker, when you left the chair at six o'clock I was trying to show the House that there was no reason why the government of to-day should not take hold of this question in a businesslike way and carry it to a conclusion. BIGGEST GUNS COULDN'T PIERCE

Bombardment at Close Range Withstood by Armor-Plated Turret.

OLD POINT COMFORT, Va., May 31.—The biggest naval gun, the heaviest known, combined with those range and deadly aim were today allowed to work their full havoc on the turret plate of the monitor Florida. The result is declared to be a victory for turret construction and this, notwithstanding the 11-inch hardened steel plate was blackened and broken, the seams of the turret sprung and the rivets and screws loosened and twisted. It took minutes after the terrible impact that the finely balanced mechanism of the turret was being worked with perfect ease and the 12-inch gun on the left side was trained at will. Inside the turret the havoc was much less apparent than from the outside. Examination showed that of the many delicately adjusted instruments for fire control, sighting and operating the turret, few, if any were out of working order. "If this had happened in battle the Florida would be fighting yet," said one of the Rear Admirals, with enthusiasm. Then followed a futile attempt to destroy the newly designed fighting mast erected on the stern of the Florida. After five shots from the Arkansas' guns had gone ripping through it, the mast still stood firm. "Forty shots would not hit it," said one of the admirals, "and no enemy would waste ammunition and time shooting at it." It was the expert comment. It was predicted that all new ships will be equipped with battle masts of this design.

confederation the Dominion Government offered to pay for the railways Newfoundland had constructed to the amount of \$9,000,000, while the province of Prince Edward Island had to pay for the construction of its own railways previous to confederation. I pointed out that on that account since confederation the province had been losing \$157,000 a year, and in interest alone had paid to the Dominion government over \$5,000,000. That in itself, along with the principal, \$3,144,214 would be nearly the total cost of the proposed tunnel. I then went on to show how the province had been treated in regard to the new subsidy Bill of last session, giving the opinions of the press and of public men, including the late lamented Sir John A. McDonald and the present premier. I spoke of the attitude of the province, which could not be said to be due to party feeling, because the local government is Liberal; and I suppose my hon. friend from King (Mr. Hughes) will allow me to say a few words in regard to the attitude of that government without accusing me, as he usually does, of introducing party politics. Here is an abstract from the minutes of the executive council of the province, dated November 28, 1907, with regard to our claims against the Dominion government. It says: "The council deem it expedient that a memorial be prepared and presented to the Governor General at as early a date as possible, setting out all the claims of this province against the Dominion government, in terms of certain resolutions of the legislature of this province adopted during the session of 1907, particularly with regard to the claim for damages accrued since the settlement of 1901 between said governments for non-fulfilment of the terms of union with respect to the maintenance of efficient steam communication and freight rates between this Island and the mainland, and strongly pressing for payment of said indemnity up to the present time; also urging that immediate steps be taken to establish continuous communication by the best means that can be devised. The following gentlemen were appointed a special committee to prepare said memorial, namely: The Hon. Messieurs Peters, Hughes, McNutt, Haszard and Captain Joseph Read, M.L.A., and John Agnew, M.L.A. As this is a matter of great importance the committee are requested to lose no time in preparing the said memorial. (To be Continued.)

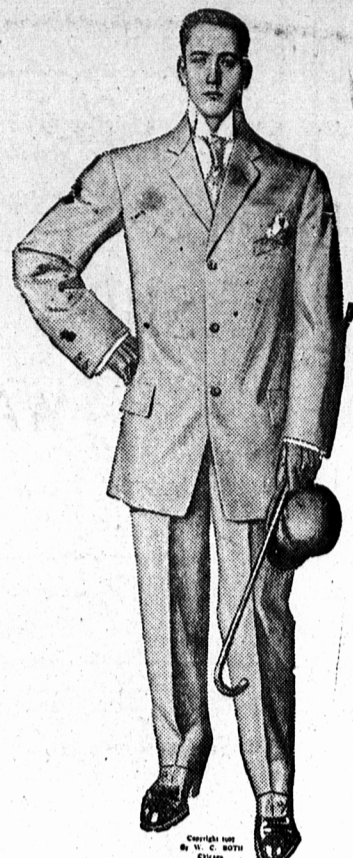

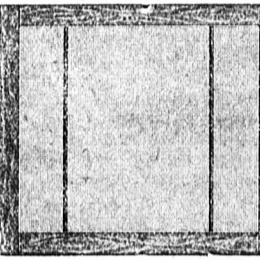

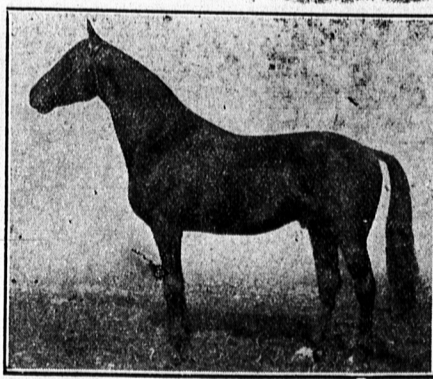
