CANADIAN OLYMPIC HOCKEYISTS ADVANCE

Mark Up Third Straight Victory By Defeating Austrians 5-2 Saturday

GARMISCH-PARTENKIRCHEN, Germany, Feb. 9.—Members of Canada's favored hockey team to the winter Olympics enjoyed a day of rest today after three victorious games on successive days. They carried the Maple Leaf in their usual winning style over Austria Saturday, scoring a 5-2 triumph built around four goals that were rattled into the European net in a shade more than that many minutes. Although there never was any doubt as to the outcome after that opening burst, in the first period, the Austrians provided the sternest opposition the Canucks have faced here. Earlier they had skated to easy wins over Poland and Latvia. The scores of those earlier games were 8-1 and 11-0 respectively.
