TUBULAR KNAPP LOOKING TO SYDNEY

If He Gets Free Site and a \$60,000 Bonus He Will Build Roller Boats - The Dominion Iron and Steel Co., Shipped 12,000 Tons of Steel:

SYDNEY, Nov. 25.—Knapp, of tubular boat fame, has written Vincent Mullins, a real estate dealer here, regarding the location of properties suitable for the erection of a plant for the construction of his steamers. Knapp states that if \$60,000 and a free site is given him by Sydney he will commence immediately the erection of his plant. Structural steel for two vessels has already been ordered in England and will be ready for shipment by the time the yard is completed and everything is ready for the construction of the vessels. Knapp declares he can turn out one or two vessels by the time navigation opens on the St. Lawrence next spring. He also asserts that the Rothschilds are willing to take an interest in his project. Knapp is expected here in a day or two. President Hanrahan of the Board of Trade is in receipt of a letter from a large dyeing concern located near New York. He is asked to give information which will enable them to determine whether or not it would be advisable to locate a branch in Sydney. The concern operates one of the largest dyeing mills in the world and is anxious to establish a branch in this part of Canada. Mr. Hanrahan is also in receipt of a letter from a large department store in Boston asking him for information regarding the advantages for opening such an establishment in this City. During Oct. the Dominion Iron and Steel Company shipped 12,000 tons of steel, about 10,000 of which went to the United States and 2,000 to points in Canada. The pig iron shipment for the same month amounted to 10,500 tons, 9,000 tons going to the United States 1,500 to Canada. The steamer Priestfield which sailed from here last Sunday for Philadelphia took a cargo of pig iron equal to over one-third of the total pig iron shipments last month. Her cargo consisted of 3,831 tons of pig iron, 1,679 tons of steel—a total of 5,510 tons. Besides the above shipments of iron and steel the Company also shipped 330 tons of sulphate of ammonia and 8,000 barrels of tar, about two-thirds of which went to the United States, the rest to Montreal.

The Weatherbie brothers were the material witnesses in each of these cases but as they had migrated to a neighboring province some days ago the cases were dismissed. J. J. Johnston appeared for all of the defendants.

Mr. Vroom, Fruit Inspector for Nova Scotia is in the city to confer regarding horticultural and agricultural questions. His attention has been directed by our Mr. Burke to the fact that a Halifax firm of fruit dealers recently sent over to the Island a shipment of very poor, trashy apples. Mr. Vroom made inquiries about the matter in Halifax. He will get more particulars while here and when he returns will take action with a view to prosecuting the offending shippers.

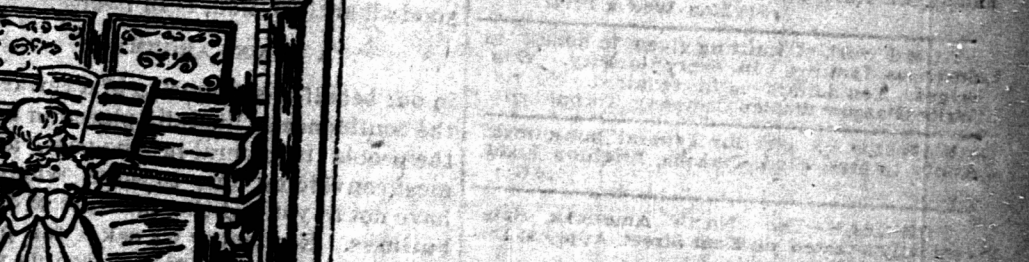
