Morning Stock Letter

NEW YORK, Sept. 21—Week end news is rather interesting. The rebels are making headway in Spain. The President has called a conference of representative of private power companies and the T. V. A. to form a late working agreement between the T. V. A. and the private power companies. This may help the utilities today. Alfred E. Smith has made public his intention to make five speeches against the new deal with the coming presidential election. Magazine steel reports operations of three plants for last week. Brooklyn Manhattan is scheduled to have a dividend meeting today. We would look for a better market today which will probably be rather broad and believe the utilities will be along the strong spots.

TORONTO — Eldorado Gold Mines Limited — Announce that shareholders of the company took up 50,769 shares of treasury stock at 95 cents per share under the recent subscription offering. Balance of the offering, comprising 247,231 has been taken up at 95 cents per share by the underwriters.

STADACONA Manager Kennedy announces considerable improvement at the mines. Eastern development on the 450 foot level which would indicate upward revision in grade. Assays taken at regular five foot intervals in work across the stope give average between \$15 and \$16 per ton.

TORONTO, Sept. 21—(CP)—A buoyant market in the base metal group today lifted the Toronto exchange's Miscellaneous Mines index to a new high for the year at 153.35, up 3 points for the day. At noon the index stood at 154.04. Profittaking in the last hour trimmed the gains in the base metals and pushed the gold a little further downward. The gold share index dropped a point to 141.05. Volume was the heaviest of the last five sessions.

On a turnover of 24,000 shares, Sudbury Basin advanced 45 cents to 5.30. The noon high of 5.40 was the stock's highest price since the 1929 Falconbridge registered an all-time high at 10 5/8 but dropped all the gain but 1-8. Hudson Bay and Noranda added narrow fractions. Sherritt added 5/8. Waite-Amulet 5, Pernat Orille 7 and Bess Metals, Com and Dominion Explorers were saggy nippers. The close:

Currencies NEW YORK, Sept. 21—(CP)—Canadian Currency improved 1 64 per cent to 100 3/22 cents in terms of United States funds at the close of today's foreign exchange market. Pounds sterling and French gold Francs lost 5 16 cents at \$5.05 1-4 and .00 1-8 cent at 6.58 3-8 cents, respectively.

PRODUCE MONTREAL, Sept. 21 (CP) — Butter prices showed little change in light trading on Montreal open produce markets today. Cheese and Potatoes were somewhat easier and Eggs steady. Butter sold at 24 1-2 cents per pound for c/slots or less of no. 1 while lots to retailers were 26 for solids and 27 for prints. Graded eggs shipments in cartons or less were quoted at 29-30 cents a dozen for a large, 27 28 for a medium, 22 for B and 20 for C. Cheese averaged 14 1-2 15 cents for Ontarios and 14 1-4 5-8 for Quebecs. Potatoes: Que. no. 1 80's 90; no. 2 80's 90; N. B. 90's \$1.10 \$1.15; P. E. I. 90's \$1.25 \$1.35.

GRAIN WINNIPEG, Sept. 21 (CP)—Steadily increasing foreign demand for Canadian Wheat sent futures prices skyward on Winnipeg grain exchange today. Week-end export sales aggregated 3,000,000 bushels, with Italy among the buyers. Values closed 2 1-8 2 1-4 cents higher selling for most of the day at levels not seen here since August, 1930. The October future—which set a new six-year high of \$1.08 5-8—closed at \$1.08. December \$1.06 3-4 and May \$1.08 1-2. Coincident with the heavy foreign purchases were forecasts that Canada would dispose of all her supplies of wheat before the end of the present crop year, July 31, 1937. London newspaper predictions said Italy, which already has bought more than 2,000,000 bushels, would take another 60,000,000 bushels, from the dominion. Cash and coarse grains reflected the action of the major commodity.
