CRIMINAL CASES IN MONTREAL

MONTREAL, Oct. 15.—Stanislav Tomachuk, detained as a witness in connection with the murder of Onofre Batara and his wife found brutally clubbed to death last Friday in Lachine, has refused to eat since Sunday and still persists in refusing food. Told by the Lachine police chief that if he did not eat, he would die he replied: "I want to go and see my God." He is very nervous and continually paces his cell.

INDUSTRY SPELLS PROGRESS

In defining the difference between a statesman and politician, Dr. Eaton said: "A statesman is a man who thinks in terms of the whole problem, not in terms of any one class, but in terms of society as a whole, and the world as a whole." He said that science has been the medium of progress in the past age, but in the new age the organ of civilization was industry. The principles of religion and democracy would be applied in the relationship between Capital and Labor. The man in industry has got to be bigger than his job if he is to be big enough for his job.

BELIEVES WORLD MOVES

Dr. Eaton declared that he was an optimist, and that he believed in progress. "There are a lot of people," he said, "who think that the world is not going to be better without some sort of a catastrophe, and they think that this is the highest form of religion. They are welcome to it. I believe, the world is best today than when I was born." (Lancet)
