THE SECRET DOSSIER.

We are told that at the first trial of Capt. Dreyfus, more than four years ago the case against him was exceedingly weak and his acquittal seemed a foregone conclusion when suddenly the secret dossier was brought on the scene and all was changed. The dossier was not permitted to be seen by either Dreyfus or his counsel, nor was the nature of its contents disclosed to them. This is the almost incredible part of the story. The prisoner's counsel had no chance to test the genuineness of this new, incriminating evidence, or to learn anything as to the source whence it was obtained, or to offer testimony in its refutation.

The plea for conduct so monstrously repugnant to our sense of justice, was that high reasons of state, delicate concerns of diplomacy, forbade the court to permit this precious and mysterious document to be put into the hands of the defence. But the prosecution claimed, and the first-court-martial affirmed that the dossier settled the question of Dreyfus' guilt beyond the possibility of a doubt. It is to be observed that Dreyfus and his counsel were perfectly willing to keep the great state secret, and to give any required assurance that they would do so, but they were not permitted to see, or learn the contents or nature of this terrible document.

It has been surmised from the fuss and mystery about the dossier that it had some relation to affairs between France and Germany and might if made public endanger international peace. Reckless rumor even went so far as to assert that the secret document is in the hand-writing of the German Emperor. But the German court was unwilling to lie under such an imputation, and it is believed that a hint from Berlin reached Paris which has effectually quieted the report that the dossier was of German origin.

It is this document which the judges of the new court-martial have spent four days in examining. There have been so many forgeries and frauds exposed in connection with the Dreyfus trial that it is by no means improbable that the dossier may turn out to be also a forgery. In any case now that a public trial is to be given the prisoner, it seems almost certain that the nature of this mysterious document must be, at least in part disclosed. In fact the sense of justice in France has been so far aroused that it has become imperative in its desire to learn the real truth about the secret dossier.

The production of alcohol from sugar beets has become a great industry in France. Formerly molasses was the common raw material for distillation, but now 36 per cent of the alcohol distilled in France is from beets, against 33 per cent from molasses.

The Halifax Chronicle relates that a few days ago the Town Council of Dartmouth called a meeting of the ratepayers in order to ask for authority to expend a considerable sum of money to improve the water supply. When the hour of meeting arrived there were only two or three ratepayers present beside the Mayor and Councillors, and the latter had to go out into the streets and by-ways to drum up a sufficient number to make a quorum. If the Councillors present had bethought them of the precedent set them by the federal Government in the plebiscite they could readily have concluded that all the ratepayers who were absent from the meeting were opposed to improving the water supply.

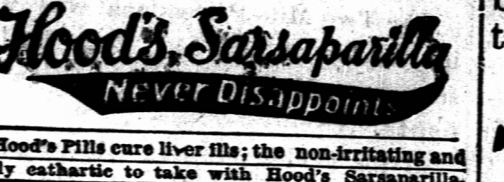
There has been this year a terribly fatal array of lock-jaw cases in America. The deadly nature of the malady, and the absence of any known remedy have so far rendered lock-jaw cases especially alarming. Just now Dr. Fanoni, an Italian physician of New York claims to have discovered that hypodermic injections of 2 to 3 per cent solutions of carbolic acid in distilled water afford an almost certain cure. Dr. Fanoni says the doses "are usually from three to four centigrams of the solution daily, though they have done as high as 35 centigrams in one day without any sign of carbolic-acid poisoning."

It is said that if the Prince of Wales should die it would cost the British, French, German and American insurance companies collectively \$10,000,000 to pay the policies on his life. Not more than \$1,000,000 of this is secured for the benefit of his family. Several millions are held as security for His Royal Highness' creditors. More still has been placed for pure speculation by outside parties. In England any man can secure a policy on the life of the neighbor, provided he can persuade the neighbor to submit to a medical examination or find a company which has recently had him examined. Thus when the Prince of Wales undergoes an examination for insurance lots of speculators apply to the same company for policies on his life, or get certified copies of the report of the medical examiner and use them with other companies. They pay a high premium, a margin so to speak, or to put it in another way they book a wager with the insurance companies that the Prince will die before the total of their premiums exceeds the amount of the policy.

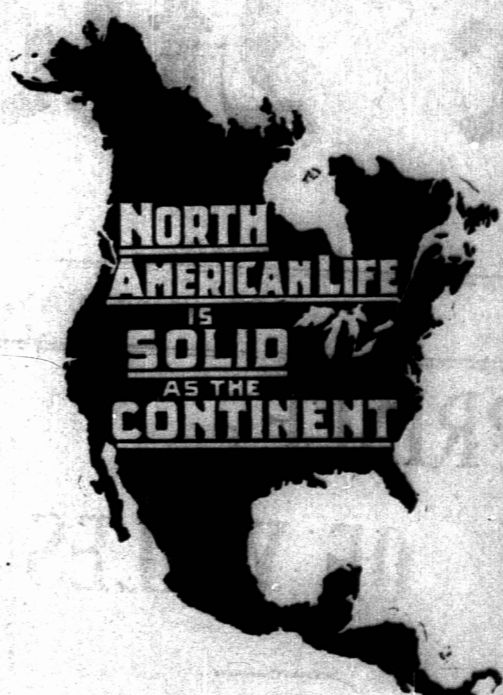
