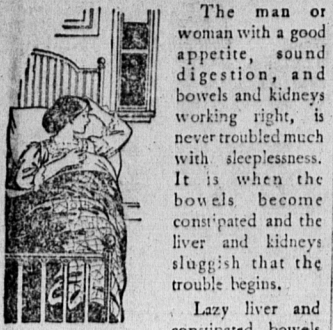

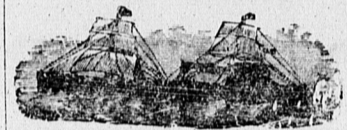

The funeral of the late Dr. D. McKay of Kensington will take place on Tuesday, 13th at 2 p. m. from the residence of W. F. Brown to Summerside Cemetery. Funeral will leave under the Masonic auspices. Many citizens will hear with regret of the death of Miss Penelope McNutt of Darnley, aged 88 years. Miss McNutt was an estimable Christian lady and a survivor of that generation who remembered well Dr. John Keir and Dr. Geddie, the first missionary of the Presbyterian Church, and delighted to recall and speak about the fine men and women of that time. Hon. Peter McNutt is a brother-in-law and his many friends will be glad to know that he is improving after a serious illness.

The death took place at the residence of his father-in-law, Wm. H. Brown, Summerside, on Saturday last, of Dr. Dahl T. McKay of Kensington, after an illness of several months. Deceased was the son of the late George B. McKay, Clifton, and was forty-three years of age. At nineteen he graduated from Prince of Wales College taking a first class honours in the teaching staff of Summerside High School. In 1892 he entered McGill graduating in 1895, and receiving the degree of M.D., C.M. On his return to this Province he practised for a short time in Summerside afterwards removing to Clifton, where he remained about one year, since which time he has carried on a successful practice in Kensington until his last illness. In 1897 he married Miss Lucy, daughter of Wm. H. Brown, Summerside, who with two children Eric and Jane, survive him, also five brothers W. K. in Edmonton, John in Western Canada, Archibald in United States, Wellington in New Brunswick and Hugh at Clifton. Also two sisters Mrs. Nicholson of Stanley Bridge and Mrs. McEwen, Clifton. The funeral takes place from Kensington.

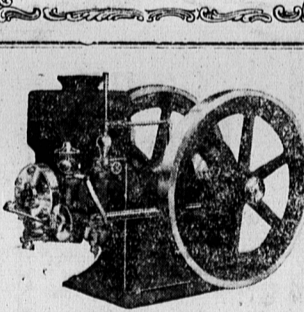

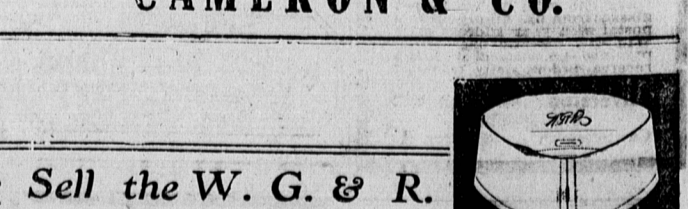

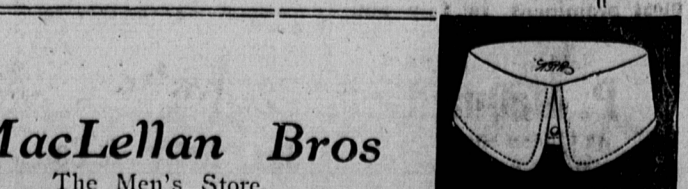
