"Dictators"? If War Comes, Britain Will Boast a Dozen

THEY'LL GOVERN IF LONDON FALLS

LONDON, Great Britain will have 12 "little dictators" if war comes.
Aware that London, seat of the government, might well be so blasted by enemy airplanes as to disorganize centralized government, the British government has divided the country into twelve districts. Each of these would, in such an emergency, be practically an autonomous "state," with its own independent government, ruled by one of the "dictators." Civilians and military alike would obey his orders.
They are not called "dictators." Sir John Anderson, Lord Privy Seal in the Cabinet, who appointed them, gave them the title of "Regional Commissioners for Civil Defense."
In peace time they will have no salary and less power. In war...
