## CUMBERLAND TO BE SOLD.

BOSTON, Aug. 8.—The Eastern Steamship Company has surrendered the steamer Cumberland, which was recently badly damaged by collision in the harbor by the steamer Admiral Farragut, to the companies which insured her and she is to be sold. The steamship Company will build a new steamer for the Maine and St. John, N. B. service at Bath, Maine.

## CANADA REVENUE.

OTTAWA, August 8.—The Canada Gazette was issued today on account of tomorrow being a holiday. It has the financial returns of the Dominion for July. The amount of revenue received for the month was \$4,272,587, compared with \$3,800,207 for July of last year, or an increase of \$472,223. There was an increase in all the branches of the service.

## EARL ROBERTS PLEADS.

LONDON, August 8.—Because colonials gazetted into British regiments, on account of distinguished service in the field, are looked upon as outsiders, even in corps where the officers are drawn from the ranks of the middle classes and lower, Earl Roberts has issued a special memorandum pleading for better treatment of colonials.

## NO TREASURE FOUND.

VANCOUVER, B. C., Aug. 8.—The ship Blakeley, which left Vancouver nine months ago to search for the hidden treasure, on Cocos Island in the Pacific Ocean, returned to-day. The search was thorough but unsuccessful. The Admiral of the British Pacific Squadron made a search without success several years ago.

## APPOINTED TO HALIFAX.

LONDON, August 8.—It is understood in military circles that Major-General Kirkpatrick, former lieutenant-governor of Ontario, who served in the recent war in South Africa, has been appointed deputy assistant quartermaster general at Halifax, and that he will leave to take up his new duties in September.

## NO MORE DISPENSATIONS.

LONDON, August 8.—A despatch from Rome says the Pope has notified the reigning houses of Europe that no more dispensations for consanguineous marriages will be granted. It is the wish of the Pope, says the despatch, that royal marriages contract marriages outside of royal families in order to stop degeneration.

## FREE SITE, NO TAXES.

SYDNEY, August 8.—The delegation representing the directors of the Port and Rolling Mills, of St. John, have consented to remain over till Saturday to inspect probable sites to-morrow. The town will likely grant them a free site and exemption from taxation for a certain number of years.

## CAPE BRETON RAIL RECORD.

SYDNEY, August 8.—A. R. Whitney, New York multi-millionaire, left here this afternoon and made a run to Point Tupper, a distance of ninety-one miles, in one hour and fifty-five minutes, which is about the fastest time ever made on the Cape Breton railroad.

## DOMINION COAL COMPANY.

SYDNEY, August 6.—During the month of July the Dominion Coal Company paid out over \$285,000. This is nearly \$40,000 in excess of the previous month's wages paid.

## CANADIANS TO ISSUE WAR OFFICE.

A despatch from Kingston states that men from the 3rd, 4th, 5th and 6th regiments have retained council to sue the war office for a year's pay. The men have contributed \$5 each.
