NEW YORK, Feb. 16.—Even the aristocratic silver fox is being hit by the high cost of living these days. Although experts estimate that his annual board bill for himself and wife is only about \$75, he now faces the prospect of going back to his former diet of horse meat after a period during which atter beef with now and then a bit of lamb or pork, was not considered too expensive fare for him. According to reports that have reached the New York Fur Auction Sales Corporation from North Western Canada, some of the biggest silver fox ranches in the Dominion are now in the market for a number of horses to be used as fox food. Horses weighing from six hundred to eight hundred lbs. are preferred.
