Chicago's Mayor Termed Typical Englishman

LONDON, Nov. 16.—"Big Bill" Thompson is the most typical Englishman who ever lived in the United States, in the opinion of St. John Ervine, the dramatist. In a luncheon address at the English-speaking union, which has been one of the targets in Mayor Thompson's Chicago campaign against British propaganda, Ervine proved his point by strict logic. "Everything Mayor Thompson has done is typically English," he said. "The first thing an Englishman does when he leaves England is to

rebel against the homeland. The most violent antagonists to England are all the people of English origin living in foreign lands. "This is because Englishmen do not tolerate tyranny. Because America was largely colonized by Englishmen, it became an independent country. Had America been inhabited by Scotsmen, the United States still would be a British possession. "When I read Big Bill's exploits, I say to myself, 'My heart warms to that man.'" Ervine recalled that Prime Minister Baldwin recently praised Thompson's Americanism, from which the press deduced that Baldwin wanted Britain to have a more intense spirit of nationalism. Conflict Ends In Nanking Victory

(Special to the Guardian) SHANGHAI, Nov. 15.—The conflict between Nanking and Hankow seems to be ended, with complete victory for Nanking, which will greatly strengthen the Nanking government. The Hankowites are sending peace envoys to Nanking, and it is said that a settlement will be effected, thus terminating attempts of Hankow to set up an independent government. In the meantime the disorders in the Wuhan cities—Hankow, Wuchang and Hanyang—are dying down, and with Japanese marines landed at Hankow and British marines standing by in readiness to land if needed, hope is expressed that there will be no further trouble. The rioting and looting in the native city of Hankow are said to have originated in discovery of the body of Gen. Chang Kuowei, Hunan commander of the eighth army, who had been strangled to death. In revenge the general's troops looted and burned the headquarters.

Martinez Defeats Divodi In Battle

NEW YORK, Nov. 15.—Hilario Martinez, sensational young Spanish junior welterweight, continued his drive toward a title bout by whipping Andy Divodi, crack New York youngster, in a 10-round feature match at Madison Square Garden tonight. Martinez scored 144 pounds, two more than Divodi. The heavy punching Spaniard, who whipped old Jack Britton and young Sid Terris in his most recent starts, came from behind to batter out the decision after Divodi had clearly outpointed him in the first four rounds. In the fifth a short right hook to the chin dropped the Spaniard but he was up without a count. The decision, greeted with disfavor by the 15,000 fans who witnessed the battle, came to Martinez through an aggressive surge that carried him to the front in every round after the fifth. Bruce Flowers, negro lightweight from New Rochelle, N. Y., won a sizzling ten-round decision over Sammy Vogel, of New York. Joe Glick, Brooklyn, trounced Jack Bernstein, former junior lightweight champion in a ten-round gem-final to gain a shot at Tod Morgan's 130 pound crown here next month.

LOUGHRAN WINS

PHILADELPHIA, Nov. 15.—Tommy Loughran, recognized by Pennsylvania boxing authorities as the world's light-heavyweight champion, battled his way to a 10 round judges' decision over Pat McCarthy, of Boston, at the Arena tonight. The fight was full of action with Loughran doing most of the leading. Loughran weighed 173 lbs. McCarthy 186.

Bliss Was His Name, Blissful His Life

LONDON, Nov. 18.—Baron Henry Bliss, of Belize, British Honduras, formerly of Brandon Park, Suffolk, and of Marlow, Buckinghamshire, who left personal estate in England valued at £330,497, in addition to property worth about £22,800 in British Honduras, bequeathed the bulk of his fortune for a Baron Bliss Trust for the development of the colony of Honduras. The eventual total value of the bequest will be about £360,000. The colony is only 8,500 square miles in area, with a population of under 50,000. Only British-made machinery and Empire materials are to be used under the trust. The will, made a few weeks before his death in March, 1926, states: "My married life has been very happy, and I have never experienced an unhappy day. He directed that his body should be embalmed and buried on the point of land overlooking Belize Harbour, and that over his grave should be erected an obelisk in the form of a Cleopatra's Needle, with a small light. His bequests include a life annuity of £300 to the nurse who attended him at death.
