OUR PEAT BOGS.

Some time ago the Dominion acquired a peat bog, 300 acres in extent, about 40 miles east of Ottawa with a view to demonstrate the value of peat fuel for domestic purposes, or as a source of power for industrial purposes.

In Europe peat is used for fuel purposes to the extent of ten million tons per annum. It is chiefly used for domestic purposes, for which use it is well adapted, being clean, easily handled and efficient.

A WELL-OFF GOVERNOR-GENERAL.

As is stated upon what seems credible authority that no Governor General of Canada during thirty-five years past has been able to live and maintain the state and dignity of his position on the salary of \$50,000 and a travelling allowance of \$25,000 which the Dominion provides.

His Royal Highness, the Duke of Connaught, will be by no means dependent upon the salary to be paid him as Governor General. His share in the estate left by Queen Victoria is generally believed to be a matter of between five and fifteen million dollars.

liament, as one of the younger sons of Queen Victoria, besides which he draws \$25,000 a year as Field Marshal in the British army. And incidentally the Canadian Government lights and heats Rideau Hall at a cost of some \$8,000 a year.

HOW EXPENDITURES GROW.

In 1896 the Dominion expenditure on immigration was \$127,438. Last year it was \$1,079,129.

Fifteen years ago the cost of Canadian Indians was \$880,408. Last year it was \$1,449,961.

Militia and defence cost \$1,136,713 in 1896 and last year \$6,868,651.

In the same period the cost of collecting the customs revenue grew from \$945,215 to \$2,187,174, and the cost of collecting the excise revenue expanded from \$464,426 to \$703,659.

There was of course a larger revenue collected in both branches, but why the expense of collection should be doubled is not altogether clear.

CANADIAN FINANCES.

The Public Accounts of Canada for the fiscal year ended with 31st March last made a very good showing. The total receipts were \$117,884,328 and the total expenditures \$122,863,250.

The difference was something under five millions. Put in another way, the ordinary expenditures were \$87,774,198 and the expenditures on capital account were \$30,852,963, and \$1,203,416 was paid into the sinking fund.

An ordinary account there was a surplus of over thirty millions, which came fairly near to the amount of the capital expenditure.

Trade and revenue receipts since March last have continued to boom, giving promise of another big surplus for the current year, which will end with the close of March next.

NOTES.

Clean premises, good water, good sewerage, and pure food are prime requisites to health in any city. Disease and death are inevitable where these or any of them are neglected.

All meats for home consumption should be inspected. The Dominion inspection law only provides, for the inspection of what is exported, and thus increases the danger of diseased meat being sold within the Province.

RIOTOUS TORONTO STUDENTS FINED.

TORONTO, Oct. 25.—A fine of \$180 imposed upon six of the S.P.S. sophomores who participated in the "scrap" at Toronto University, is what was meted out by the caput who called the offenders before them.

President Falconer, in an open letter to the Varsity Journal, places on record the attitude of the caput as follows:—

"The two encounters which occurred this week between the first and second years in the faculties of medicine and applied science, make it necessary for me to call the attention of the students to the university regulation which forbids such proceedings."

"The possibility of accidents, already this year sufficiently serious, the stricture of clothes, and the use of blacking, constitute these disorders, a breach of regulations which may involve severer punishment than the heavy fine that has been imposed on six students who participated in the disturbances."
