

Tragic Drowning Accident In Ont.

OTTAWA, Aug. 10.—Five lives were lost in a tragic accident at Lombardy, Ont., today, when Thomas Toohy aged 53 years and four children were drowned in the waters of Otter Lake, one of the Rideau chain lakes situated four miles from Smiths Falls, Ont. After the father and three daughters made a gallant effort to save the life of Laura Toohy aged nine years, who while bathing waded beyond her depth, Thomas Toohy fifty-three years of age, father of the Toohy family, Bernard, twenty-seven eldest son, Kathleen Toohy twenty-five years, Dorothy Toohy, eleven years, and Laura Toohy, aged nine.

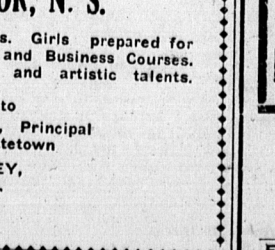
Another Mystery Craft

The Steamer Alaska Goes To the Bottom After an Explosion Ship's Boilers

SEATTLE, Wash., August 9.—During a thick fog the coastwise steamer Alaska struck a rock four miles off the northern coast of California at 9.40 o'clock last night and went to the bottom twenty minutes later, with a loss of 110 believed tonight to be at least forty-eight persons. Ninety-six passengers and seventy members of the crew are known to have been saved by the steam freighter Anyox, which was five miles away when the Alaska went on the rocks at Blunt's Reef. According to officers of the Anyox, which has arrived at Eureka, Cal., forty miles from the scene of the wreck, it is doubtful if there are any more survivors.

Abandoned on Fire

NEW YORK, Aug. 9.—Captain Peterson and the crew of the United States schooner Cecelia Colton, reported yesterday abandoned afire off Cape Hatteras arrived here today on the steamship West Keene, which rescued them. The schooner, bound from Tampa for Philadelphia with phosphate rock, struck heavy weather August 6, began to leak and was abandoned with 12 feet of water in her hold. She was seen on fire to remove a menace to navigation.
