ANARCHIST PRINCESS COMING TO AMERICA

LONDON, Nov. 16.—Great curiosity has been aroused here by the announcement that the Princess Kropotkin, a member of the Russian nobility, and an anarchist, intends to visit America early next year.

The Kropotkins, who are exiles from Russia, have lived in London for the past twenty years. The Princess is a well known and respected author and a man of science, while the princess is almost as gifted as her husband, having taken degrees at the Universities of Paris and Geneva.

To ask for, receive, or take any money employment or other reward for a vote or for refraining from voting is Bribery. Penalty for Bribery is

forfeiture of \$325.00 for each offence to the person who shall sue for the same. Every person giving liquor to any Elector on Polling Day within an Electoral district where such polling shall be held; is liable to a penalty of \$16.00.

Penalties not exceeding \$65.00 may be sued for in a summary manner before two Justices of the Peace for the County. In default of payment or recovery of the penalty the offender is subject to imprisonment.
