THE DUTY OF TEACHERS.

Mr. Percy Pope, Secretary-Treasurer of the Monument Fund has very properly drawn attention to the fact that as yet but thirty-five out of more than four hundred school teachers have responded to the appeal made to them by circular to interest themselves in the Fund. Large subscriptions are not asked for nor expected, but we feel assured that by a very little effort on the part of the teachers something might be obtained in every school district of the Island.

It is quite possible, more than probable in fact, that many are only awaiting the opportunity to contribute their mite to this worthy and patriotic object. It is one in which the entire Island community should join, for all have shared in the honor which our brave soldiers have reflected upon the country, and in the credit of the great service they rendered to the Empire. It is true that the erection of a Monument is already assured. But who would not add a stone to build it higher? Our soldiers offered, and some of them gave their lives for a great cause and on a great occasion. We are asked but to give dollars or dimes to keep green their memory, and to signalise their work.

Besides, there is to be a notable record of what is donated and by whom—their names will be inscribed in a memorial volume to be preserved in our provincial archives. Charlottetown citizens have subscribed nobly to the Monument. We feel sure that when the account is finally closed our patriotic school-teachers will not be willing to have it said of them that they had no share in the work, and that their names and those of their bright pupils have no place in the record referred to. We therefore trust they will respond quickly to the final appeal. It is necessary that the Committee shall know at as early a date as possible the amount of the Fund which will be available.

The letter of T. W.M. in another column dealing with Canadian poets and poetry, is we think, an interesting and valuable contribution to the discussion of that subject. All will not agree with his conclusions, but we think it must be admitted that there is something in the social life and conditions, possibly in the climate also, of both Canada and the United States which tends to clip the wings of the imagination and hold the artistic sense in abeyance. The cause may lie deeper than we think. A gentleman of wide reading and experience in a conversation on this subject has pointed out to THE GUARDIAN that even the birds in Canada do not sing with the same spontaneity, strength and variety of notes that characterises the birds of the British Isles and the Continent of Europe.

All must agree that a library much more extensive and valuable than any yet in existence has become a provincial need. And we think that very few will doubt that it should be established in Charlottetown, as the Capital and the most populous centre on the Island. The use of the Colonial Building as a home for it will harm, or menace no one not residing here. It will be simply applying the room to a worthy public use. We therefore trust that any momentary opposition to such action may be withdrawn. It is clearly not well-grounded.

The Sunday afternoon meetings for young men have been very largely attended and are quite helpful. J. Ritchie Bell of Montreal will conduct special services for young men for two weeks commencing March 17.

The action of the ladies in forming an Auxiliary is an expression of the general interest being taken in the work.
