Dr. Penfield asserted that "the Canadian Government has done practically nothing to establish special centres for the care of war injuries of the nervous system; nothing at all in Quebec and the Maritime Provinces."

Dr. Penfield amplified his charge by narrating how his institute, which has today hospital accommodation designed for 47 patients, in trying to meet an increasing demand for treatment for war patients, had overstrained its facilities to take in sometimes as many as 100.

This revelation of ministerial indifference to needs of men and women who have risked their lives in the cause of freedom coincided with a grand conclave of young Liberals in Winnipeg, where the party tom-toms were being beaten to rally the faithful for the next election campaign.

EDITORIAL NOTES

In connection with Mr. Gandhi's recent release, it is important to recall the real reason why he was detained in the Aga Khan's Palace for 21 months.

Earl Kitchener of Khartoum, British soldier, died this date 1916; one of the greatest soldiers of the Empire, who made good in the Sudan and South Africa when others failed, he was to the people of Britain in 1914 what Winston Churchill was in 1940 and now; during the Great War I, when the problems of raising and equipping vast armies were more than one man could cope with, he called others to his assistance; nevertheless it is impossible to over-praise the magnificent service which he rendered to the Empire in those dark days when the fate of Britain was in jeopardy; in 1916 while en route to Russia to consult with the chiefs of the Russian Army, his ship, H.M.S. Hampshire, struck a mine, and all her crew as well as Kitchener were lost.

International Monetary Stabilization

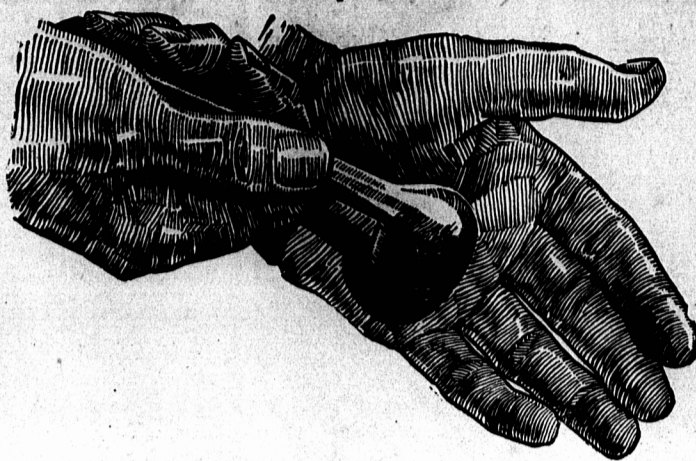
Monthly Review of the Bank of International Monetary Fund.

The draft plan for an International Monetary Fund, recently agreed upon by experts from thirty-four nations, is a system of international exchange rates, which has been made toward a plan capable of commanding general international acceptance.

Multilateral trading is only possible if each country has adequate liquid resources. The primary purpose of an international monetary plan is to provide them.

The Review goes on to explain in considerable detail the other provisions of the Plan, especially those which limit the amount of surpluses and deficits which a country could finance through the use of gold.
