MR. D. C. McDONALD AND THE AUTO TAX.—Reporting the Legislative proceedings of March 31st, Mr. D. C. McDonald was erroneously quoted as having referred to the \$25,000 auto tax annually applied to paying the federal highway grant interest as a mere "bite." Mr. McDonald's statement was that if this money had been applied directly on the highways instead of being funded the amount of work done would have been a "bite bite."

purposes. But there is no proof that the hon. member's charge in this case is correct. "The bill he read was simply a bill for work done on the roads. This matter of his opponents was not taken to further, as it was outside the subject, and he regretted that it had been brought up at all.

Mr. Stewart complimented the hon. Commissioner of Public Works and his ingenious and lengthy speech in defence of his policy. To an impartial hearer it might be thought that he spent perhaps too much time on the defensive—he had spent more time slaying his opponents than in elaborating his policy. A little more information in detail and fewer personal remarks and criticisms might have left a better impression. When he undertook to challenge the hon. member for New Perth (Mr. Dewar) as to his mandate he rather put his foot in it. The speaker did not intend offering a defense of the hon. member as he had very capably defended himself when he declared himself in support of the same policy by which he stood at the last general election. Surely he has the same mandate to preach the same doctrine that he had preached when he was elected?

"But I would ask the hon. Commissioner this question: Has his party as good a mandate as my hon. friend for New Perth? What mandate have they got? Did they preach the policy to the people that they are carrying out today? If they did so, their press certainly did not, when they came out in big scare headlines about the amount of money the government was going to spend for the highways, and when they asked the people time and again where and how the money was to be raised. What mandate have they since received to induce them to turn around and adopt a policy which is for the purpose of working a scheme which is not permanent, and which will require still a very large expenditure to keep up."

"Hon. Mr. Dewar: It is the system. Hon. Mr. Dewar: Would you agree to having imported gravel hauled here to build the roads?"

"Hon. Mr. Dewar: I don't agree with any part of it. Hon. Mr. Dewar: I was quoting Mr. Squires. He said that right in this House, and the Patriot reported it. Why wasn't he corrected if he was wrong?"

"Hon. Mr. Dewar: We don't get up and interrupt speakers every five minutes like some people. Mr. Brodie: Why was it quoted in the Patriot?"

"Hon. Mr. Dewar said Mr. Brodie was also wrong in quoting that he (Mr. Dewar) had said 'the farmers were rich.' He said the people here had no profitable investment for their money and that the highways bonds would be a good investment."

"Hon. Mr. Dewar spoke of the fact that the government is not adding to the public debt and that it will not cost the province a cent because they will pay off the debt by funding the auto fees. But before this scheme was promulgated the auto taxes formed a part of the revenue of the province, and they still continue to belong to the revenue. Now it is proposed to provide a sinking fund out of this revenue for the purpose of meeting the interest on these borrowed sums as if borrowed in the same way. The public treasury in every case, from whatever source of revenue it comes, whether from auto taxes, income taxes or poll taxes. And in every case it comes out of the revenue and it rolls the public treasury of this amount."

"It is to be remembered that the permanency of this source of revenue—the auto taxes—is by no means guaranteed. It cannot be said to be permanent in the same way that the land tax is permanent, because it depends upon the permanency of the automobile business. This business may increase, and again it may decline. It is to some extent a fad and no policy founded upon it can be a surety."

"In looking over the Public Accounts, I find that the accounts with respect to the highways have been made up to the 31st of October. The expenditures up to that time have been carried forward into the general account, and that ac-

count has been balanced and credited against the total automobile fees for last year. There is also the loan of \$125,000 balanced against the expenditures. But I find on looking into the returns which have been tabled here, and which I have had an opportunity to examine, that of the five contracts for last year completed and paid up, about \$12,000 has been paid since the 31st of October which have not been included in this balanced account and which must be carried forward to next year, or paid for out of some other fund, because the auto fees have been already used up in meeting the payments made up to that date. There are several other contracts not completely settled yet, and while we do not know the amount yet we know that they are large ones, and that there will be about \$25,000 in all of last year's work which will have to be carried forward and paid for from some other source of revenue. If you pay this out of next year's auto fees how much will you have left to meet next year's expenditures? This does not seem good business or sound policy. How those projects are to be settled and accounted for is a matter that should receive some explanation.

"My position on this proposed measure is briefly this: First, the government has not a mandate from the people to borrow these vast sums of money which will be charged up to the public debt; and secondly, that you are borrowing for the purpose of working a scheme which is not permanent, and which will require still a very large expenditure to keep up."
