MINISTERIAL PENSIONS TO CEASE.

There is a report that at least one of the ex-cabinet ministers who were pensioned for life by act of Parliament last year at half their cabinet salaries, made good speed to sell out his pension for a present cash consideration. This individual, whose name is not publicly known, was wise in his generation, for Hon. Mr. Fielding has introduced a bill to repeal the pension scheme outright.

This is done as a concession to the strong sentiment of opposition to these pensions in the country, and also with a view to reconcile the electorate to the Members' and Senators' salary grab, which is under almost equal disfavor. To save their extra thousand of indemnity they are willing to sacrifice the ex-ministers. But the Commons have yet to reckon with their constituents.

The reckoning will come in one of two ways. Members who voted themselves the increased indemnity will have to face their party conventions and these may naturally prefer to select other candidates who would not be under the odium of the salary grab. There will not be wanting other men willing to run the election in their place and such may be chosen in not a few instances about the country.

Where the present members are again put in nomination by their party conventions, the fight will come at the polls, and the indemnity question may turn the scale in the contest. It will be a heavy handicap for any member who voted for or consented to the extra indemnity whether he be Liberal or Conservative, if he is opposed in the election by one who will pledge himself to use his best efforts to repeal it.

The country will welcome the repeal of the pension scheme. Few of the ex-ministers had any need of "poor relief" in this form, most of them are far better provided for than the majority of the Canadian people and several of them are wealthy. But the repeal of the pension bill will not be accepted as any atonement for the increased indemnity to members, which was adopted and retained against the well-known wishes of the electorate.

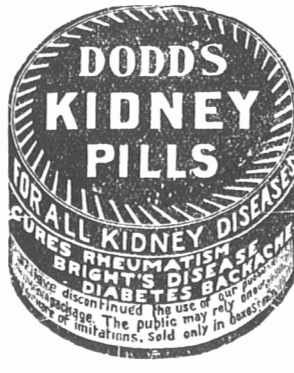
Senator Robertson is quoted in an Ottawa despatch as stating that the Senate furnishes an example of parliamentary dignity, and that it preserves the best traditions of the British system. The episode between Senators Miller and Ross during the present session can hardly be quoted in confirmation of this opinion, but it was rather exceptional. Mr. Robertson is further quoted as favoring an election of half the Senators every five years, if the Senate should be made elective.

EMINENT ISLANDERS.

Saturday evening was the date fixed for closing the ballot on the names of Eminent Islanders. The number of ballot papers received was not large, but from the names of the voters who are responsible for them as well as for other reasons we conclude that the result may be acceptable as affording a fair indication of popular sentiment on the subject. Those who sent in ballot papers were necessarily of the class who take an interest in the achievements of our public men past and present. It required on their part some thinking to each select just twenty names and arrange them in the order of merit in which each voter thought they ought to be placed, and only one who felt that he had some knowledge as well as interest in the subject would take the pains to mail a list for publication.

In all something more than a hundred different names were submitted as worthy of being ranked among the eminent ones. From the first list received down to the last two names took easy precedence of all others for first or second place on the list. These were Hon. George Coles and Hon. Edward Whelan, who evidently hold a high place in the grateful memories of the people of this Province. They received an almost equal number of votes, and an almost equal vote for first place, but the slight majority rested with Mr. Coles. Together they received more votes for first place on the list than all the other hundred persons who were named on the different ballot papers.

We hope to be able to announce the list of Eminent Islanders tomorrow, as the result of the voting during the past few weeks.

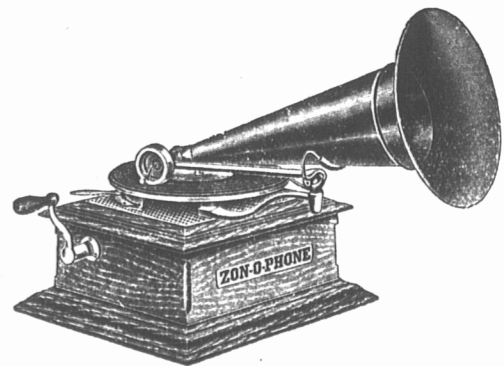

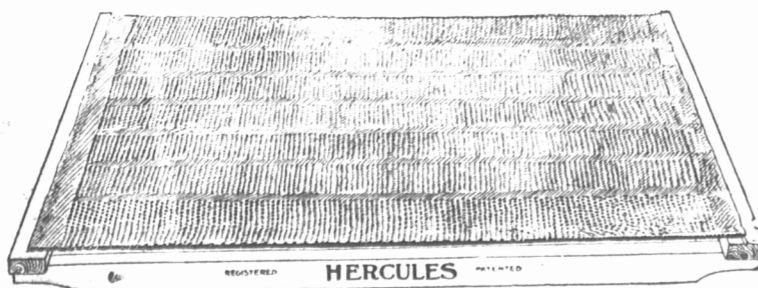
