A SIGN OF THE TIMES.

Workingmen's Paper Wants Civic Beauty Conserved and Enhanced.

At great expense the civic corporation and private citizens have done much in recent years to beautify the city, and the result has been most gratifying and favorably commented upon, both by residents and visitors. Still, more might be done in the line already adopted, with but little expense on the part of the city or individuals; but in a direction involving absolutely no expense no move has been made.

Who with an eye for beauty or an abhorrence of outrageous ugliness can have failed to notice the rag-town appearance the city presents for weeks preceding the advent of the annually-looked-for circus? Great flaming streamers are tacked all over buildings, even on the main streets, windows are disfigured with glaring pictures of impossible performances, and the billboards made to look so loud that they can be heard blocks away.

The result is unmitigated ugliness, without the slightest excuse therefor.

Billboards in their normal state are an eyesore, and should be done away with by a city bylaw, as was done in Cleveland. In that city the owners refused to remove their abominations in accordance with the city's orders, so Mayor Tom Johnson had them chopped down and carted away, and the result was less ugliness and more beauty.

Another feature offensive to good taste is the glaring advertisements

of the patent medicine hawkers on the plank walls and benches of bus-stops, places and private houses. There is no reason why the city should allow these to be used for other than the announcement, in a decent and reasonable way, of the business of the occupant.

There is the overhanging sign masses and backwoods, hick-storying way of displaying goods outside their windows and doors. Sometimes the displays being disgusting by the sight as well as man-of-woods, and always looking out of place.

Occupants of property have a right to use their premises up to the street line, and not one inch farther. If a man appropriates a foot, another will take two and a third, and, greatly to the inconvenience of pedestrians.

Why should all these things be permitted? The nuisance, as important, the city gains no advantage, and the growing beauty of the city is marred.
