OTTAWA, July 10.—A Dublin Firm, writing to the department of trade commerce, asks for the names and addresses of manufacturers of butter and egg boxes. The firm is prepared to take 5,000 butter boxes unmade weekly. They have communicated with a few firms in Canada, but could not get satisfactory replies.

**MEDALS HAVE ARRIVED.**

OTTAWA, July 20.—The South African medals have arrived at the department of militia. They number 2,703, and are contained in seven cases. The department will at once take steps to have them engraved and then ship them to the different points at which they will be presented by His Royal Highness.

**LABRADOR IS ICE BOUND.**

St. JOHN'S, Nfld., July 21.—The mail steamer Home which arrived here to-day from Labrador says that the coast is blockaded with ice floes especially the northern part, where the floes are impenetrable. This will greatly delay the Paary relief steamer Erik, which arrived upon calling at Turnaik, Northern Labrador, and landing her last mail before entering the article circle.
