CLEVER BURGLARS MAKE A BIG HAUL

NEW YORK, July 17.—One of the most finished pieces of burglary which the police here have seen lately was revealed yesterday when a big five-foot, double-doored steel safe in the jewelry store of Joseph Fass, on the east side, was found with a spacious hole cut cleanly out, through which the robbers abstracted \$30,000 worth of precious stones and jewels.

An electric drill, which did the work, and other burglar implements lay beside the looted safe. A large hole was in the wall between the store and an adjoining barber shop, and three steel bars of the barber shop's window cleanly sawed off indicated the entrance and exit of the robbers.

FIND MAN MURDERED.

NIANTIC, Conn., July 13.—That the man whose body floated into the Niantic river here yesterday from Long Island Sound had been murdered was established today by the medical examiner, who found that a rib had been fractured, that the man's hands and feet were tied with hemp cords and that a similar cord was tied around the neck and two other cords tied to the body with loops to which weights had evidently been attached. The medical examiner is of the opinion that the man had been thrown from a ship passing through the sound, as the shoes bore the name of a Northampton, England maker.
