In referring to the Ravel Humpty Dumpty Co. The Sydney Record of Oct. 28th, says: A large audience greeted the Ravel Humpty Dumpty Co's first appearance in Rosslyn Park last evening. The performance was highly appreciated and deserved the enthusiastic reception accorded it. The character of the entertainment is high-class and clean and deserves the approbation and patronage of the amusement loving people of Sydney. The entertainment was divided into three sections, the first giving the travels and experiences of Humpty Dumpty in pantomime the second introducing many fine artistic specialties, and the third being a nice distribution of the pantomime and vaudeville.

The market for new print will probably take on a new phase when the Hull mills start again. The E. B. Eddy Co., Limited have received part of their new machinery for the paper mills, and they expect that early in November they will have two large machines going, which will turn out about 40 tons of paper every 24 hours. They will start making new print, leaving the manufacture of other papers till later. In addition to these two machines they will install others from time to time during the coming six or eight months, so that in the Spring there will likely be some seven or nine machines in full swing, turning out all their regular lines of different papers, and, perhaps, two additional lines. The mills, when complete will be nearly one-half larger than the old mills. The match factory will be in full operation next month, having been enlarged one-third over the old one.—Oct. Printer & Publisher.

AN Ottawa despatch of 28th says: Mr. F. C. Hare of the Department of Agriculture arrived in the city this morning from Whitby and Chatham, after superintending some of the most important experiments that have been made by the department for some time. They were in regard to the feeding of poultry with the aid of a crammer and the result has been so satisfactory that they will doubtless lead to the feeding of poultry by this system on an extensive scale for the English and foreign markets. All illustration of what has just been done along this line might be had from the experiment at the station at Whitby. For that station 134 chickens were purchased a month since and the total gain in weight of these was 283 lbs., the cost of producing each pound of gain being a fraction over 4c. Just how much the profit on the transaction is will not be known until the carcasses are sold in England, but it doubtless will be an encouraging one. We know that there is an unlimited market for properly finished poultry. [It will be remembered that Mr. Hare visited Prince Edward Island some time ago in the interest of the chicken fattening stations now being conducted in this province.]
