IN MEMORIAM

MRS. D. J. MACDONALD

On Friday, Aug. 27th, there passed to her eternal reward, at the early age of 53 years, Mary, beloved wife of D. J. MacDonald postmaster of Vernon Bridge. The deceased, who was in failing health for almost a year, bore her sufferings with Christian fortitude, but despite the best medical aid and kind attention she gradually approached the end.

Mrs. MacDonald was amiable and generous in the home and upright and obliging in the post office where she discharged her duties as post-mistress faithfully and well for upwards of fifteen years never complaining at the ever increasing and often trying tasks that thus beset her path. Here her ready mind shone forth. In short Mrs. MacDonald possessed all those sterling qualities that make the heart and true woman.

She was attended in her last illness by her pastor, Rev. P. D. McGuigan who administered to her the last rites of the Holy Catholic Church. The floral and spiritual bouquets were many and beautiful—a small token of regard.

The funeral cortege, which took place on Aug. 30th, was one of the largest to wind its way to Vernon for ever Cemetery. The services were conducted by her cousin, Rev. J. C. MacDonald.

Besides a sorrowing husband there are left to mourn two brothers and one sister, John and Bella on the old homestead and Peter of Winchester, Mass.

The heartfelt sympathy of the whole community goes out to Mr. MacDonald in the loss he has sustained.

JOHN McLEAN

There departed this life at his home in DeSable, on the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty, John McLean, one of the oldest and most highly respected citizens of that community. He had reached the advanced age of ninety years, and up to the end of his journey retained the use of all his faculties. The late Mr. MacLean was a man of unassuming disposition and few words, but with widely known and greatly esteemed on account of his wise council, extreme honesty, and patient industry. He was a person of keen intellect, and in his early life was one of the most successful School Teachers in the Province. He was a life long member of the Church of Scotland, and for many years occupied the responsible positions of Clerk of Session, and Secretary and Treasurer of the congregation, and discharged his duties to the entire satisfaction of all concerned. He was well versed in the doctrine and form of procedure of his beloved Church, and never swerved in his loyalty and fidelity. His whole life manifested the value of Christian teaching and exemplified his unflinching faith in Jesus Christ. As the end drew near, his trust in his Saviour never faltered, and the consequences of a well spent life cheered him as he patiently awaited his Master's final call. To mourn their irreparable loss he leaves a widow and one daughter, Euphemia Isabelle at home. He also leaves two brothers, Allan and Angus at DeSable. The funeral service at the house and grave was conducted by his Minister, the Rev. Jas. MacDougall in the presence of an unusually large assemblage of people. Interment was made in the family plot in the Kirk Cemetery at Argyle. The pall-bearers were his six nephews, A. A. MacDougall, Angus Cameron, D. J. Campbell, John Cameron, Duncan MacKinnon and George Campbell.
