FARM HINTS FOR PROVINCIALISTS

FEEDING VALUE OF WHEY DOUBLED. The practice of pasteurizing whey has been in vogue for the past year with the result that patrons find the condition of the whey, as regards sweetness, flavor and feeding value, better than formerly; the cans are sweeter and easier to wash, less greasy and more adhesive to them, and they will probably last longer.

PREVENTING THE WINTER KILLING OF STRAWBERRIES BY STANDING WATER.

It frequently happens that a spring rain or melting snow will cause ice to form on low or hollow parts of a strawberry bed, the ground not being thawed sufficiently to allow the water to seep in.

BUTTER FORTY-TWO YEARS OLD.

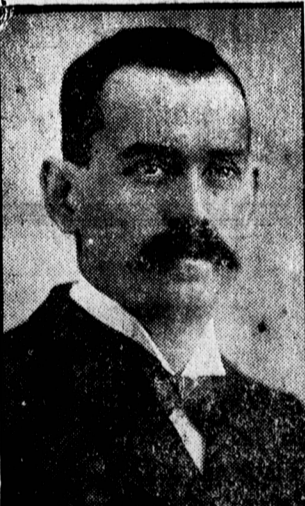
