CAKE OF SAVOY

Separate with care five yolks of eggs and put them in a plate with one half pound of sugar and the outer skin of a lemon. Beat until the mixture becomes white; add one fourth of a pound of potato flour and do not beat the paste too hard. Beat thoroughly the white of eggs and mix them with the paste. Pour whole into a form greased with butter and sprinkled with sugar. Cook for an hour in a slow oven.—Jamesville Gazette.

CANADA BORROWS MONEY IN LONDON

LONDON, Nov. 17, (Special)—Money was wanted Saturday which was paid day on the Stock Exchange. The rate for day to day advances rose slightly when a trifling sum was borrowed from the Bank of England, but there was no real pressure. The discount market was easy at the opening, but became quite firm later owing to the withdrawal of £200,000 for Canada and the re-marking of £180,000 for India account. Bar gold amounting to £102,000 was received.

SIMPLE RULES FOR WINTER TIME

(By a Physician.) The season is changing! Do you realize it? Are you prepared for it?

An old-time physician once said, "Begin the winter right, before it starts, and you'll be pretty well kept right till summer comes again." There is more in that than may at first appear.

Beginning right means preparing in time! Don't wait until you have caught a first cold before you put on your warmer underwear.

Don't wait until your feet have been soaked in the first rain, with the probable cold and rheumatic twinges afterward, before you buy out on your strong winter shoes.

Don't leave the small but necessary repairs to the basement furnace until after the first cold snap.

Don't forget that exercising briskly in cold or even damp air is usually harmless, but that sitting in a cold damp house or in wet clothes, is very likely to be followed by any one of a number of winter ills.

Keep the house well ventilated even in the stormiest weather, always remember that the sleeping apartment should be the airiest in the house.

Keep as great a variety of food on the table as you can all winter long not forgetting that nutritious food heat.

If a contagious disease is making headway in your neighborhood, keep yourself and the children out of overheated, stuffy places, where large numbers of people congregate.

Have a care for the drinking water. A good filter is a safe device.

In short, begin the winter with the doctrine of prevention, and the question of cure will very largely take care of itself.

WILL NO ONE SAVE THE BROOMHANDLES?

Do you realize light-hearted reader, as you sweep the autumn leaves from your doorstep or make the hearth trim for a cheery evening or otherwise lay hands upon that seemingly simple implement, the broom, that you are toying with a terrific problem? asks The Atlanta Journal.

Have you heard the warning of the learned statistician that ninety million broom handles are going to waste each year in this prodigious land and that so dire a drain upon our forest resources calls for serious national thought?

Will you not be one in a crusade of earnest souls to check this wanton extravagance and devise some plan for conserving the country's future supply of broomsticks?

The broom itself is necessarily an ephemeral thing. Its purpose in life, as Col. Roosevelt once said of himself, is to spend and be spent. The better it is used the sooner it wastes away. The good broom dies young; only the bad are burned to the socket. There are, to be sure, rascally brooms that begin to shirk their duty before they are half through their allotted span of service; but their most conscientious broom cannot be expected to last as long as its aristocratic kinsman, the toothbrush. Its term is as brief as that of the season's straw of which it is born.

For the broom handle, however, there is no such excuse. A little thrift mated to ingenuity should make the average broom handle serve several generations, as Chinese garments are said once to have done. Yet, the American people are heedlessly throwing away ninety million broom handles every year.

What is to be done? Shall our noble forests be ruthlessly destroyed merely to satisfy an idle whim for new broom handles? Science admonished us that this will come to pass unless we grapple this problem in a spirit of practical patriotism. Surely the American people, whose resourcefulness has converted into wealth broken bottles and waste paper and old tin cans and a hundred other once unconsidered trifles, will not fail to utilize the broom handle. Frivolous persons may be disposed to treat this matter lightly, but the frugal and really philosophic will grasp its far-reaching consequence and never rest satisfied until they have found a solution.

GINGER DROPS

Half cup of white sugar one cup light-brown sugar, two thirds cup molasses, one tablespoon ginger, pinch salt, two thirds cup lard, half cup cold water, one large teaspoon soda, flour to make thick batter. Drop from spoon on greased pans, giving plenty of room to spread. Bake in moderate oven—San Francisco Call.

UNDERWRITERS IN LONDON UNEASY

LONDON, Nov. 17, (Special)—The Canadian Associated Press understands that considerable misgivings have arisen among London underwriters in connection with the sale of the Canadian Great Lakes. They feel that in adopting the present insurance rates on vessels trading on the Canadian Lakes they did not take into account the possibilities of such a serious gale as that which has just occurred.

Roughly the loss of the underwriters is estimated at \$1,500,000, but judging from later cables this figure may be considerably increased.

THE ANTI-SALOON LEAGUE.

Several of the Diocesan Clergy attended a very inspiring meeting of some 400 business men and ministers, at Luncheon, at La Salle Hotel, on Monday, Oct. 27, at which ringing addresses were made by business men and by national and local officers of the Anti-Saloon League, describing the splendid fight against the saloon which is being waged all over the nation at this time, as well as showing the wonderful progress made in establishing "dry" territory during the past twenty years since the League began its work. An average of a million and a half of our population each year, for the past dozen or more years, has driven out the saloon. Whereas 20 years ago there were about 16 million of our population in "dry" territory there are now, over 46 millions living where the saloon is prohibited and banished. This remarkable meeting at Hotel La Salle was called for the purpose of focussing attention in Chicago upon the Congressional effort to adopt some kind of a National "Dry" Measure as an Amendment to the United States Constitution. It would require 36 States to ratify it; and the leaders in this winning fight are sanguine in this large attendance, when a business-man, a man, will travel all the way from Pittsburgh to Chicago just to speak 20 minutes or less at such a luncheon on "The Anti-Saloon Movement as a Promoter of Industrial Efficiency" one may safely predict almost anything in the way of results. The interest in this work is increasing among the Clergy and laity of this Diocese.—Letter of the Living Church, News Bureau, Chicago, Ills.

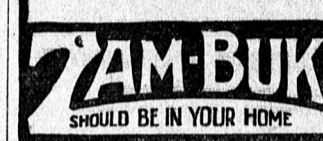
