THE FOX INDUSTRY

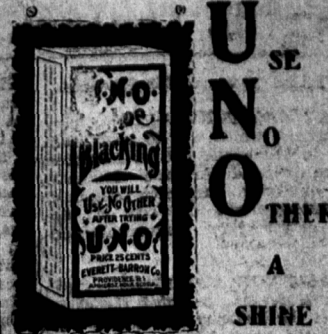
