He came through safely although quite a few of his friends were killed or wounded. He says there is not much time for writing but when the big scrap is over he will give particulars and is in good health.

**STRAY COW.**—A Jersey cow with but apparently any owner has been roaming loose around Brighton for the past week or so. The owners of gardens in that locality are hostile as the animal has broken into numerous gardens and played havoc with the vegetables. Charlottetown is badly handicapped in not having a pound or stray animals. One sure thing the property of citizens should be protected and there are too many such animals at large.

**RUNAWAY.**—A bad runaway occurred in the city on Sunday afternoon when a countryman's horse attached to a buggy, took fright and bolted up Euston Street. The buggy contained the owner and his wife and child. The horse was utterly beyond the control of the driver and near the Milk Factory he came into collision with a fence with the result that the shafts parted company with the buggy, and the horse with the shafts only clattering at his heels and frightening him more proceeded full speed on his way horsing some ten miles out of town. The occupants of the buggy, who received a bad scaring but fortunately nothing worse met, a good Samaritan in the person of Mr J. O. Hyndman, who on hearing the facts offered to take them to their home in his automobile. He had not been using his car that day conforming with the request of the Government in regard to the saving of gasoline but in view of the circumstances he took his car down town and got a supply of gasoline and very kindly conveyed the victims of the accident to their home, an action which needless to say was deeply appreciated.

**WOUNDED IN ARM.**—Mrs. J. A. Moore Pownall, has received word that her son L. Corp. Clifford Moore, infantry is officially reported admitted 22 General Hospital Camiers, Sept. 3 Gunshot wound, radius fractured. Corp. Moore went over to France in November 1916 in the first draft from the 105th and was in charge of a machine gun since January last.

**THIRD SON TO BE WOUNDED.**—Mr. Rodk. Matheson, P. E. I. R. policeman, Charlottetown, has received a telegram notifying him that his son, Pte. John Daniel Matheson had been admitted to No. 3 General Hospital, L'etreport, on Sept. 8th suffering from gunshot wounds in the back, legs, hands and face. This brave young man was wounded also on a previous occasion about a year ago, in the head, and upon his recovery went back to duty. He left here with the 98th Siege Battery and later transferred to the 7th Ottawa Battery. He is the third son of Mr. Matheson's to be wounded. Mr. Matheson has four sons on active service and his son-in-law was also "over there" and returned home wounded.

**HOME ON FURLOUGH.**—Private James Sudbury of Searletown who recently returned from England was visiting Charlottetown a few days ago. He enlisted in Winnipeg, Manitoba on the 9th day of August, 1914 and went overseas with the 1st Canadian Expeditionary Force. After training in England for several months he went to the firing line in February, 1915 and remained in France three years and one month. He fought in the 2nd battle of Ypres, the Battles of Festubert, Somme, Vimy Ridge and Passchendaele. He went over the top seven times and returned uninjured, although he had the heel of his boot shot off and his helmet pierced by shrapnel in several places. However, as a result of the Battle of Passchendaele he is a sufferer from shellshock. Out of 1100 men who enlisted with Private Sudbury there are but six others surviving. Private Sudbury's many friends are very pleased to welcome him on his return to civil life after so many trying experiences.

So the less each individual takes for himself or herself for personal use the more effort will there be left for fighting and winning the war.

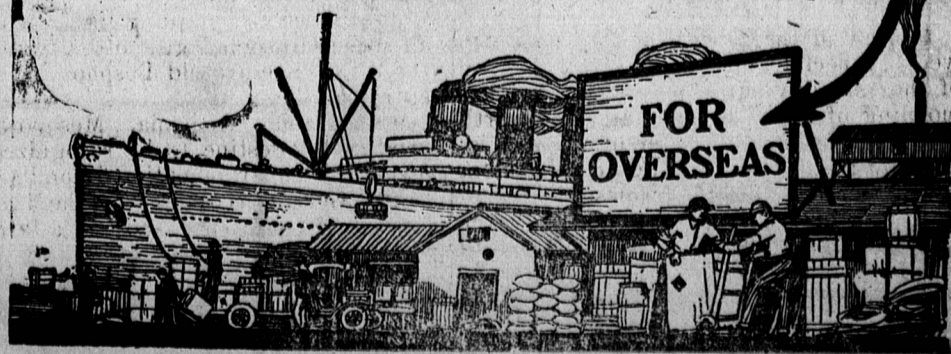
Every cent you spend represents that much effort because somebody must do something for you in order to earn that cent—somebody's effort must be given to you instead of to the war.
