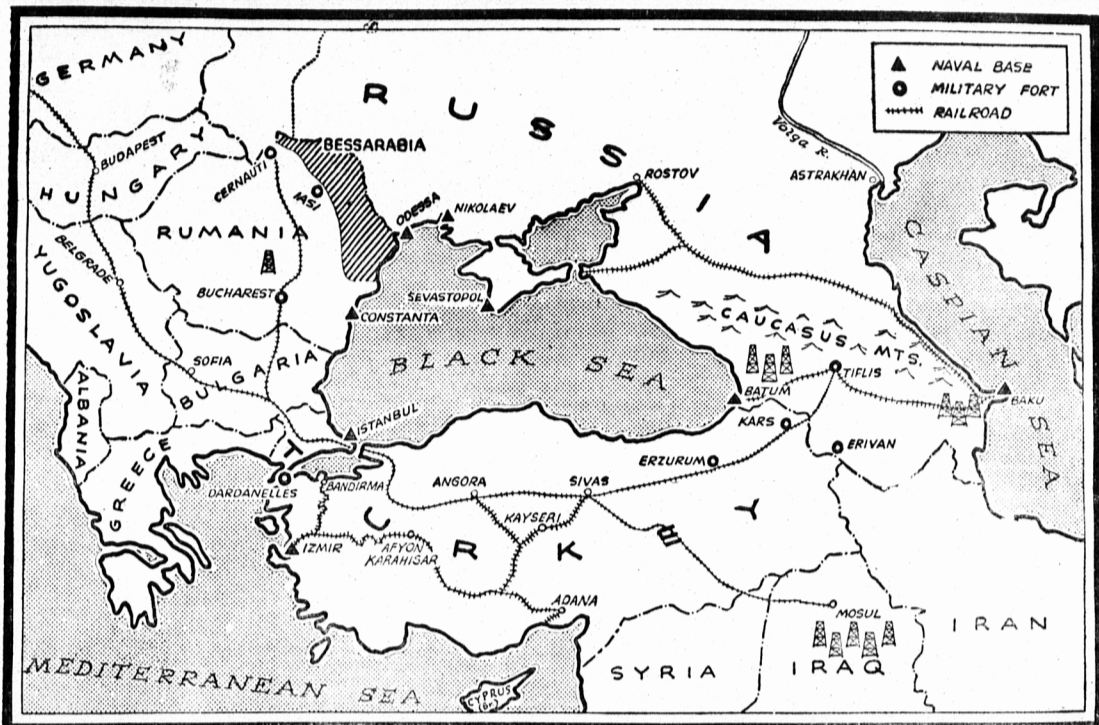
R.A.F. Bombers Knife Soupy Fog To Raid Nazis

LONDON, Oct. 17.—(AP)—British bombers knifed through a soupy fog tonight to smash at the French "navy coast" with a heavy bombardment that shook the Kentish shore on this side of the channel.

China's Trucks Roll Again On Burma Road

CHUNGKING, China, Oct. 18.—(Friday)—China's trucks of war are rolling again on the Burma road under the threat of imminent Japanese bombardment.

Netherlands Has No Intention Of Leasing Bases

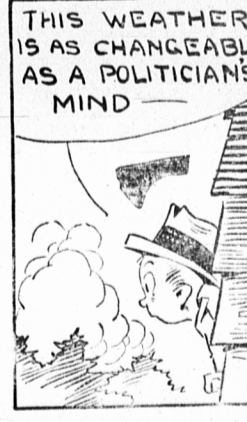
