IN CITY AND COUNTRY.

Local and Provincial Items of Interest.

Gleaned By 'Guardian' Reporters and Correspondents.

News Budget of Happenings Round About the District.

Messrs. W. H. Davison and Wm. Owen arrived home last night. Saturday 15th August instant is the last day for serving writs of summonses for the Charlottetown Circuit of the County Court.

The August sittings of the County Court of Queen's County will be held as follows: 1st Circuit at Eldon, Belfast, Tuesday, 2nd August; 2nd Circuit at Bonshaw, Friday, 5th August, 3rd Circuit at Dunstaffnage, Tuesday, 9th August 4th Circuit at New Glasgow, Friday 12th do; 5th Circuit at Clifton New London, Tuesday 16th do; 6th Circuit at Charlottetown, Tuesday 23rd do.

EASTERN ITEMS.—The persevering potato bug is putting in good work the last few days, and the farmer is waging the usual war against him. Few mackerel are taken along the north side of the Point, and some on the south side of the South Lake and West River, but nothing like the old time catches. But little hay-making has been done here yet. The hay is a fair crop but no weather to cure it. The picnic came off at East Point lighthouse and was a success. The strawberry festival also came off at Kingsborough in a field of Arthur Robertson's, by the shore of the beautiful West River. The attendants were courteous and capable, the crowd was numerous, appreciative and respectable, the auctioneer, William McLean, popular, energetic and experienced, and the proceeds satisfactory. I believe these tea meetings or tea parties are an institution peculiar to this Island alone, and something may be said in their favor, and much can be said against them, and as they have been recognised in some shape or other with some different modifications and varied attractions by nearly every church on our Island, and as newer and more questionable features are constantly being added for the purpose of parting a certain man, often mentioned in Scripture, and his money, as exhilarating fluids can always be obtained not far from the grounds, and sometimes in open and direct connection with them—fluids which excite all the mercurial and combative qualities of the human race, is it not time for the churches to ask where is this going to end? Where is the border land between right and wrong? Where does right end, and wrong begin? To the students of human nature some laughable anomalies are observable at these tea parties. The politician and the would-be politician are always there, and their wives very often occupy prominent positions on the grounds and at some tea parties, though ardent and devout disciples of Ignatius Loyola, they progress great admiration for the doctrines of the reformation, or on the other hand they may be direct descendants of McAllum More, and believe in the principals for which he contended, yet at a tea party of the suitable complexion they may express themselves as being strongly in favor of the Divine right of kings, and speak favorably of the liberality and tolerance of the present day among all denominations. The local merchant is there too and his wife often sends a cake of liberal proportions, several stories in height, fantastically arrayed in all imaginable toggery with secret instructions to some of her friends to bid it up to a respectable figure, and though she may be a lineal descendant of Jenny Geddes, at the suitable tea, she expresses herself as a great admirer of the higher ritualism, or on the other hand she may claim Graham of Claverhouse as her ancestor, and secretly glory in his exploits and yet at the proper time she may proclaim the virtue and the fortitude of the Cameronians, and the covenanters.

The singing of "Jesus lover of my soul," "Nearer my God to Thee," "Blest be the tie that binds," and other familiar hymns was grand and inspiring. After rising and singing "God be with you till we meet again," the rev gentlemen pronounced the benediction and a blessed meeting was brought to a close.—COM.

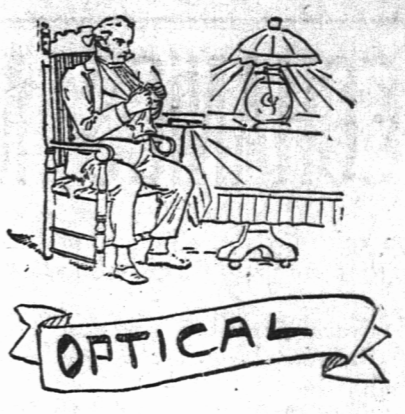
