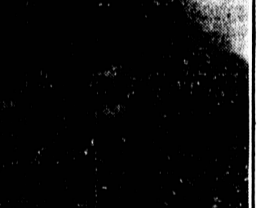

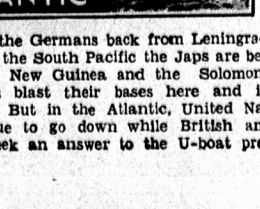

It's report card time in the U. S. and a check-up reveals Johnny Doughboy, Tommy Atkins and the rest of the United Nations fighting men are doing fine on all but one front. In Africa and Europe Flying Fortresses and other allied planes are bombing the axis in Tunisia, Libya, Germany, Italy and occupied areas while our troops make gains on desert fronts. In Russia, Soviet troops soldiers and other Red Army troops are pushing the Germans back from Leningrad to the Caucasus. In the South Pacific the Japs are being driven back in New Guinea and the Solomons while our bombers blast their bases here and in China and Burma. But in the Atlantic, United Nations ships continue to go down while British and American forces seek an answer to the U-boat problem.

NEWSY NOTES

'THE EDDYSTONE' In July 1706, the first boat-load of men and materials put off to the sea. The survey and the construction of the Eddystone Light-house had been carried away. The Rock presented a sloping surface, which Winstanley had conformed to, hoping that the iron posts would be sufficient; but the contrary sea and the violence of the wind had caused the structure to slide down into the sea. The studs of the iron posts and an end of a chain were all that was left.

When the summer of 1707 approached the work was resumed. We can get a good notion of the method of building from the Encyclopaedia Britannica. Bannister's story of the Rock and Smaston's "Narrative of the Eddystone Light-house," the last a very scarce work. Ruyderv now had thirty-six holes drilled into the rock into which "chafers" were inserted and secured by pouring in molten lead. Then great beams of solid oak were laid lengthwise on the first step or terrace, thus bringing it to a second step. The next course of timbers was laid crosswise, and came level with the third step. So the work went on, step by step; and by the time the work was fastened to the rock by iron chafers, and to each other by iron cross-braces and bolts and wooden "trenails."

It was not possible to fit the beams so closely to the rock as to exclude the sea-water altogether; and that if water should get in, with such a buoyant material as oak, it would exert a tremendous lift, and in time of storm would be apt to sweep the foundation away. Ruyderv resolved to counteract this by adding weights to the courses. He piled five courses of stone above the timber courses. Altogether the stones weighed 120 tons, and each stone was fastened to the fellow by joints, and clamps. Above the stone two timber courses similar to the first, and so terminated the "solid" part of the lighthouse. It rose to a height of fourteen feet above the rock, and was built round a central mast or pole which was the backbone of the structure.

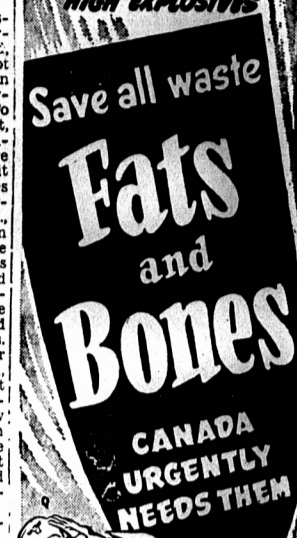
England and France were at war while the lighthouse was being built. It was the War of the Spanish Succession, which John Churchill, Earl of Marlborough, and an ancestor of Winston, made for himself a great name. The war was not over, and got the solid portion of the building well under way, and Ruyderv had returned to Plymouth leaving his overseer (foreman) in charge for the time. Towards the afternoon, a French frigate, the 'Fleur-de-Mar' was seen on the horizon. The French flag was run up, and the workmen, knowing well what was in store for them, hastily armed themselves with crowbars, picks, and large shaps of stone, and prepared to repel boarders. The lighter boat was in advance, and just as it touched the rock, a breaker turned it upside down! The crew, however, struggled ashore, and the French frigate, ordered the Englishmen to surrender. The obstinate workmen, instead of obeying, grasped with their enemies and the conflict became general. The arrival of the second boat turned the tables, and the Englishmen were overpowered. Their tools were collected as prizes, and put into the boats, their arms forced on board, and the whole party was carried on board the French vessel, where we leave them for the present.
