Water Commission Gives Explanation Of Trouble To Council & Citizens

The following communication has been received for publication from the office of the Commissioners of Sewers and Water Supply:

July 24, 1947.
His Worship the Mayor, and City Council, Charlottetown.

Gentlemen:
In reply to your letter of July 21st, it is regrettable that you and your Council should have attacked our Department over the unfortunate accident which occurred on the Mount Edward Road.

As has already been reported through the press, this accident did not occur with the knowledge of, or through the negligence of, any of our Department employees.

Although we are in doubt as to what information you are demanding from us and although by the Charlottetown Water Works Act, 1887, we are under no obligation to report to you at this time, we feel that you have through your releases to the press created the impression that the repairs made at the Mount Edward Road were not carried out in an efficient manner. We are,

therefore, submitting this date a detailed report to the citizens of Charlottetown for their information.

A copy of this report is attached hereto.

To the Citizens of Charlottetown:
At a meeting of the Water Commissioners held this day the following report of the break in the main service line at Mount Edward Road, July 4th, was submitted for your information. This break was reported about 8:30 a.m. Friday, July 4th. The Chairman and Superintendent of works proceeded immediately to the location of the break. The water was escaping freely into the trench being excavated by the Island Construction Company under the direction of the Public Works Department of the City of Charlottetown. Considerable water had already flowed into the excavation on the west end of the new road leading to the Brackley Road.

After brief consultation, it was decided to allow the pressure to continue until ten o'clock in order that the hospitals, the Maritime Electric, manufacturers, and citizens in general could be advised of the shut-down required for repair. This information was sent out by telephone and by broadcast from CPCT.

Early in the forenoon the chief of the Fire Department, Mr. James Walker, and his assistant, Mr. James Walker, visited the scene and advised us of the precautions taken should a fire occur.

Because of the nature of the accident and the appearance of the discharge of water, it was believed that a sleeve jacket repair job might be sufficient. This could not be determined until the pipe was in view. In order to bare the pipe all of the water that had escaped had to be pumped into the road ditch beyond a temporary dam which was set up to prevent the water flowing back into the excavation. While this was being done all of the equipment necessary for any type of repair job was assembled. When the pipe was cleared it was found that the break extended for about five feet below a crack on the top side of the pipe.

The replacement of this broken pipe required the cutting of the pipe in the ground and the melting of the lead connection at the other end of the broken pipe. Section seven feet long had to be cut from a twelve foot section. This new section required three but lead cutlins to make a complete and satisfactory job. All of this work was done by our own men at the location of the break.

After repairs were completed the water was turned on at the reservoir, but came in so slowly it was apparent that the valve was either not opening, or was stuck. In either case, the ton of the valve would have to be removed to get relief. This took considerable time and our employees were hampered by continuous and heavy rain. There was some further delay due to the necessity of blowing hydrants all over the city to relieve air locked in the system.
