Where there is an overlapping of the federal and provincial powers, it is quite apparent that the provincial power in regard to this matter has been exercised to the full in the Province of Quebec, if it has not been exceeded, as we think it has, while the federal authority has not attempted to exceed its powers. There appears room enough for a conflict of authority, and certainly there is good ground to seek for a more precise delimitation of the debatable legislative territory. This brings us to what Dr. Curran has to say about valid and invalid marriages. We are charged with "begging the question" in stating that "no church should be permitted to dissolve marriages that are legally performed." Dr. Curran's contention is that the marriages which the Catholic church has declared void were "no marriages at all." We used the word marriage in accordance with its commonly accepted meaning, the union of a man and woman in the legal relation of husband and wife. It is such a marriage that we affirm no church should be permitted to dissolve or to declare void. It is Dr. Curran who is begging the question in claiming the right for his church, or for the Province of Quebec to say that a marriage is no marriage. With respect to the Canadian officials in their robes of state and the

Does it not, therefore, seem absurd to talk of changing the B. N. A. Act to "remedy" a matter of such little moment? It is another case of "Much Ado about Nothing." The principle "by which The Guardian stands most firmly" viz, that "no church shall be permitted to dissolve marriages that are legally performed" is a principle which the Catholic Church has courage to come out openly and forbid its ministers to assist at the marriage of divorced persons, (although many right thinking individual ministers loudly bewail the growth of this evil which is eating into the very vitals of Society.) In view of these facts, all this loud talk about the sanctity of marriage and the preservation of the home, cannot be taken seriously.
