There will be a naval funeral tomorrow morning, and the interment will be in St. John's Cemetery.—Halifax Ex. (This is the third funeral on the Niobe since coming to Canada, the second of which was in this city.)

All efforts to save her have failed so far, but another attempt will be made this week.—Sydney Ex. This schooner is forty-five tons, and was built at St. Margaret's Bay, N. S. She was formerly owned by John M. Chapman, of Murray Harbour South, but last year sold her to parties in Nova Scotia. She is twenty-six years old.

Many friends in Moncton will learn with regret of the death of Mrs. Elizabeth Stronach, widow of the late Alex. Stronach, which occurred in Winnipeg on Thursday morning, in the 81st year of her age. The deceased's husband, who predeceased her by about four years, will be remembered as an armer general locomotive foreman of the I. C. R. in Moncton, and later a master mechanic of the P. E. Island Railway at Charlottetown. Mrs. Stronach, who was a very estimable lady, is survived by one daughter, Mrs. (Rev.) Paradis, now living in St. Paul but who was with her mother in Winnipeg when she died. He is also survived by two brothers, Howard and George Brundage, of Idnish, N.B., and two sisters, Mrs. I. W. Chapman, 1241 Main Street, Moncton, and Mrs. Thomas Mcweeney, of Winnipeg. Mrs. Chapman received a despatch yesterday informing her of her sister's death. Interment will be made in Winnipeg.—Ex.


