Asparagus Hints

Asparagus should not be cut off a new patch until the third year after the plants have been set out. To harvest asparagus, cut off the young shoots about one inch to one-half inches below the surface of the ground. Take a butcher knife and cut off the stalk with a sloping end being careful not to cut off the young shoots which have not reached the surface. The asparagus beetle may be controlled with a mixture made in the proportion of three pounds arsenate of lead (paste) to 40 gallons water.
